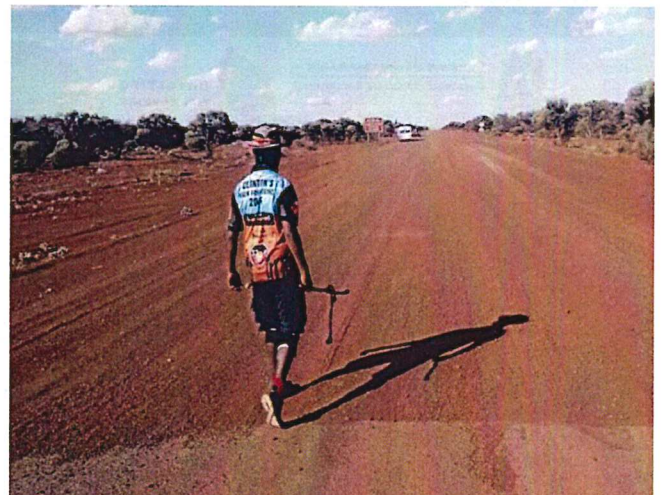
# CLINTON'S WALK FOR JUSTICE

## WILUNA TOWN VOLUNTEER BUSH FIRE BRIGADE

### ***Are you Bush Fire Ready?***

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) has launched the 2016-17 'Are You Bushfire Ready?' campaign, urging everyone in the Western Australian community to prepare ahead of the upcoming bushfire season.

Launched by the Emergency Services Minister Joe Francis on Sunday 23 October at the Department of Fire and Emergency Services' (DFES) State Operations Centre, this year's campaign features Meelon man Steve Angel, who has a powerful real-life story to share.

Steve lost his home and almost lost his son in the 2007 Dwellingup bushfire. Determined never to face such a loss again, his subsequent home preparations helped to ensure his property was saved during the Meelon bushfire that swept through the Shire of Murray in March this year.

The campaign also ushers in the launch of the new Emergency WA website, [emergency.wa.gov.au](http://emergency.wa.gov.au). The new multi-hazard Emergency WA website will provide faster, easier to access, better quality information during emergencies, in a format that people can more clearly understand.

With another challenging season forecast, it is also crucial that Western Australians prepare now to protect their safety and property in the event of a bushfire.

Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner Wayne Gregson said "Preparing for bushfires is a shared responsibility between government, agencies and the community."

"DFES staff and volunteers, alongside Parks and Wildlife, Western Power, local governments and their volunteer firefighters are working hard to prepare for the season ahead – we need everyone to play their part to ensure they are bushfire ready."

### **How to prepare for bushfires....**

#### **Plan how you will get information during a bushfire:**

- Bookmark the Emergency WA website at [emergency.wa.gov.au](http://emergency.wa.gov.au) to your mobile phone or tablet
- Become familiar with the Emergency WA website to make sure you can navigate to the information you need. During a real emergency, you might be panicked, so having a look now will help you later
- To keep up to date during a bushfire or other emergency, visit [emergency.wa.gov.au](http://emergency.wa.gov.au); check your surroundings; stay in touch with neighbours; listen to local radio or call the DFES emergency phone line 13 3337
- Follow DFES on Facebook (@dfeswa) and Twitter (@DFES\_wa)
- Follow Wiluna Town BFB on Twitter (@WiunaTownBFB)
- Sign up to an RSS feed or a mobile phone app. Several apps carry DFES warnings, including WALGA's LocalEye and private apps Emergency AUS and EWN

#### **Prepare a bushfire survival plan:**

- Develop a bushfire survival plan that outlines what you will do if a bushfire occurs
- This plan will help you take action and avoid making last minute decisions that could prove deadly during a bushfire
- Don't forget to factor in your pets or livestock - during a bushfire they will need water, shelter and a safe place to stay
- Practice your plan regularly with your family, write it down and make sure everyone knows where it is.

#### **Prepare your property:**

- Install a mesh guard on your air conditioner
- Rake up leaf litter and remove rubbish from around your home
- Prune overhanging trees and shrubs
- Keep grass short
- Keep gutters free of leaves
- Store flammable liquids, chemicals and firewood away from your home
- Put in firebreaks
- If you plan to stay and actively defend your home, you will need an independent water supply of at least 20,000 litres, a generator and pressure pump

#### **Prepare a survival kit:**

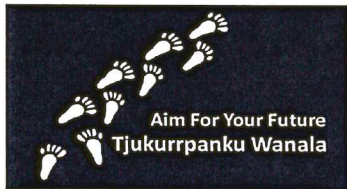
- Have an emergency kit ready to go in case you evacuate or are cut off during a bushfire
- This kit would include essential supplies such as a radio, spare batteries, torch, first aid kit, woollen blanket, emergency contact numbers, water and non-perishable food.
- On the day don't forget to add essentials such as your wallet/purse, car and house keys, medications, phone and charger and important documents.

**Did you know that the Shire of Wiluna has a Bush Fire Notice that specifies the minimum fire protection work that you must carry out on your property to prevent bush fires?**

If you are a GETS client they can help with the costs of any items.

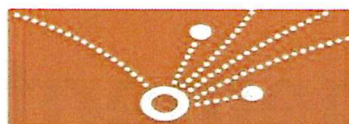

# Management of Burns

First Aid is what you do while you are waiting for help to come - that is why it is called first aid - because it is what you do first and what you do first can be very important.

**When someone you know sustains a burn injury, there are several steps you should follow:**

## 1 REMOVE

Quickly remove any clothing and jewellery from the burned area. If the clothes are stuck to the skin, do not remove them and do not pop any blisters. It is important to remove clothing and jewellery because they can trap heat onto the skin and can restrict blood flow to the area if it starts to swell.

## 2 COOL

Immediately treat the area with cold running water (e.g. from a cold tap) for 20 minutes. During this time, only apply the water to the burned area. Keep the patient warm with a blanket or by holding the child so that only the burned area is under the water and your body heat is keeping the rest of them warm.



## 3 COVER

Use clingwrap or a clean cloth to cover and protect the burnt area if remote. Do not use ice, creams oil or other substances. They will not help the wound to heal and they may cause infection or more damage. They will also interfere with examination by the doctor.

## 4 SEEK MEDICAL AID

Seek medical attention for all children's burns by calling the ambulance or going to hospital. For adults, if the burn is larger than a 50 cent coin, or it is on the face, hands or groin area, or if the burn is white in color (this means it is deep), seek medical attention.

**It is important to cool the burn for 20 minutes to stop damage to the tissue under the skin.**

**You can apply first aid up to 3 hours after the injury and it will still be effective.**

The drinking water is safe for everyone else to consume.

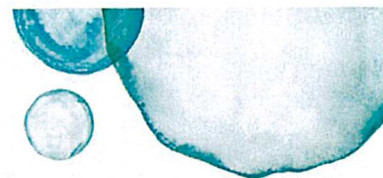

# Nitrate in drinking water

## Fact Sheet for Northern Goldfields and Murchison

Many water supplies in Western Australia are derived from ground or bore water. Groundwater often can contain a number of chemical compounds. One particular compound that is sometimes found, is nitrate. In Western Australia, elevated nitrate levels are usually in the natural process of plant decay underground that has occurred over geological time. Overseas contamination of drinking water by nitrate is more commonly associated with some form of pollution resulting from human activities. Nitrates are very soluble in water and can move easily through soil. Over time nitrates can accumulate in groundwater that may then be used as a drinking water supply.

### Does Nitrate in Drinking Water Pose a Health Hazard?

Even at elevated levels, nitrate is not necessarily a health hazard for most adults. However, nitrate concentrations above 50mg/L can cause adverse health effects in infants under three months of age, and nitrate concentrations above 100 mg/L can affect pregnant women and those adults with a rare metabolic condition called congenital glucose-6-phosphate dehydrogenase deficiency (an inability to metabolise sugar).

### Who is Most at Risk?

Infants less than three months of age are at risk from nitrate ingestion due to the conversion of the oxygen carrying haemoglobin in their blood to an inert form known as methaemoglobin. This condition (methaemoglobinaemia) occurs when nitrate is consumed and converted to nitrite. The affected blood carries less oxygen than it should, turning blue and depriving the body of the oxygen it needs. Infants in the first three months of life are particularly susceptible to nitrite-induced methaemoglobinaemia because their stomach acid is not strong enough to stop the growth of bacteria that convert nitrate to nitrite.

### Symptoms of Nitrate Toxicity

The most noticeable symptom of nitrate/nitrite poisoning is a bluish skin colouring called cyanosis, particularly around the eyes and mouth (the so-called "blue baby"). An infant with bluish skin should be taken to a doctor if excess nitrate intake is a possibility, so that it can be tested for nitrate poisoning.

### What are Safe Levels of Nitrate in Drinking Water?

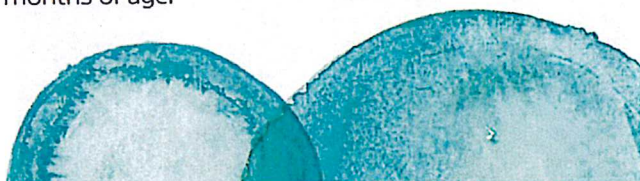
The 2004 Australian Drinking Water Guidelines, available from the National Health and Medical Research Council recommend acceptable nitrate and nitrite concentrations based on health related criteria, as summarised below.

- Less than 50mg/L: Safe to drink
- 50mg/L – 100mg/L: Safe to drink for adults, including pregnant women. Seek alternative water supplies for bottle-fed infants up to three months of age.
- More than 100mg/L: Drinking not recommended for any age. Treat water or seek alternative water supplies. If necessary seek Health Department advice.

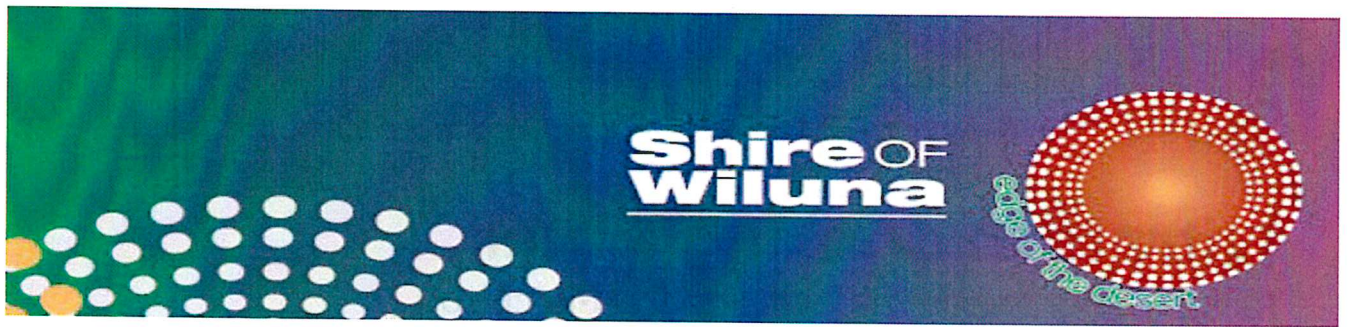
### The Role of Water Providers

Problems associated with nitrate have the ability to affect large and small scale water providers. Where nitrate concentrations are between 50 and 100mg/L, and there is no alternative supply, water providers may apply to the Executive Director, Public Health, for an exemption from the 50mg/L guideline. However, an application will only be granted where there are satisfactory arrangements to:

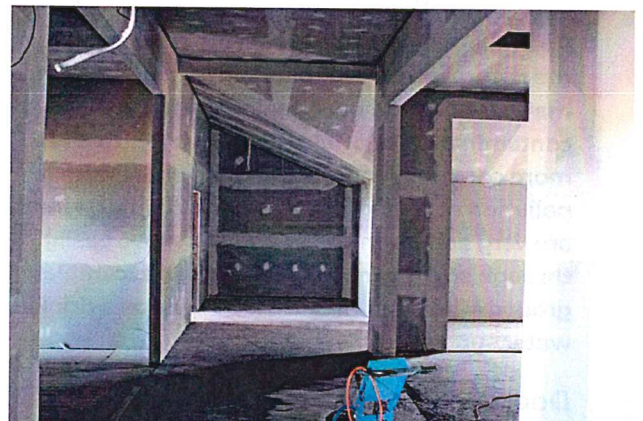
- Keep customers and home occupiers regularly informed that the drinking water has nitrate concentrations of 50 to 100mg/L and is unsuitable for infants younger than three months of age.

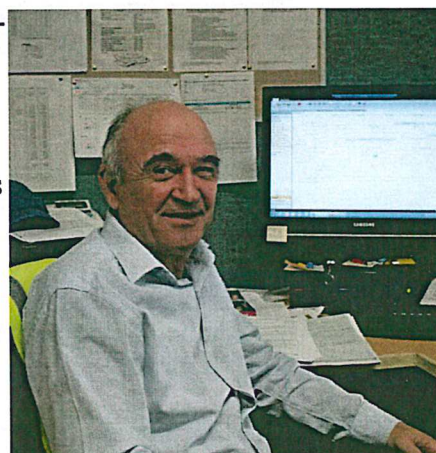

## Regional residents to shape their future

Member for North West Central, Vince Catania is urging regional residents to have their say and help shape the future of their region by completing the Living in the Regions 2016 survey.

Made possible by *Royalties for Regions*, the survey is a safe and convenient way for regional residents to contribute thoughts about their region.

The survey was a great opportunity for residents to share their perceptions and experiences of living in WA's regional communities.

"*Royalties for Regions* is transforming regional WA through the provision of essential infrastructure and services," Vince said.

"Finding out more about residents, what attracts them to live in the regions and what they like best about their region, are simple but crucial elements that are instrumental in supporting the ongoing sustainability of our regions."

Vince said it was anticipated government agencies, private organisations and community groups will use the survey findings to support decision-making and policy development across regional WA.

More than 10,000 people responded when the West Australian survey was last conducted in 2013, the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the country.

"I am looking forward to seeing what this year's results will show," added Vince.

Regional residents will also receive the survey in the mail, with 50,000 copies distributed at random across regional WA. 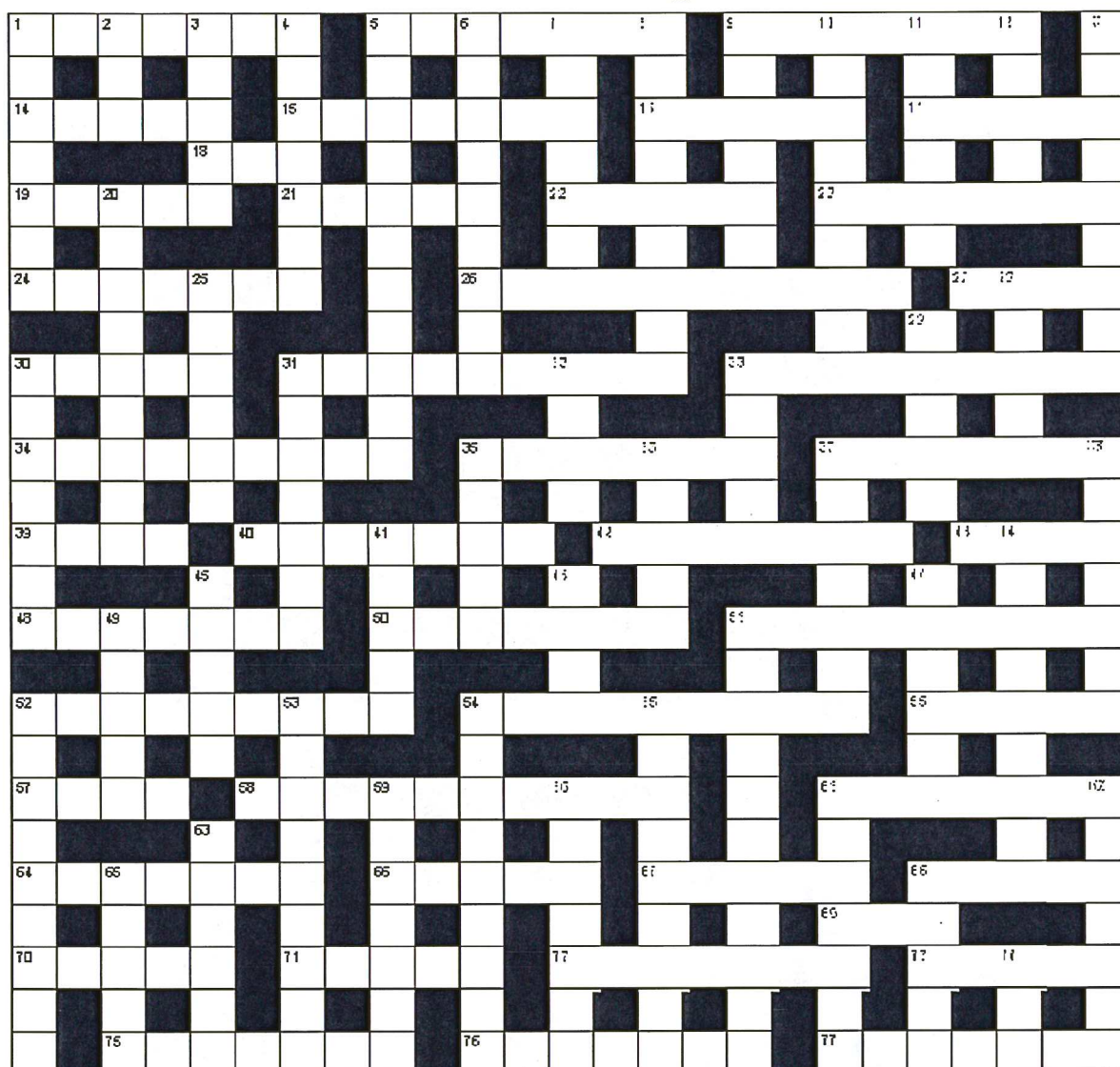

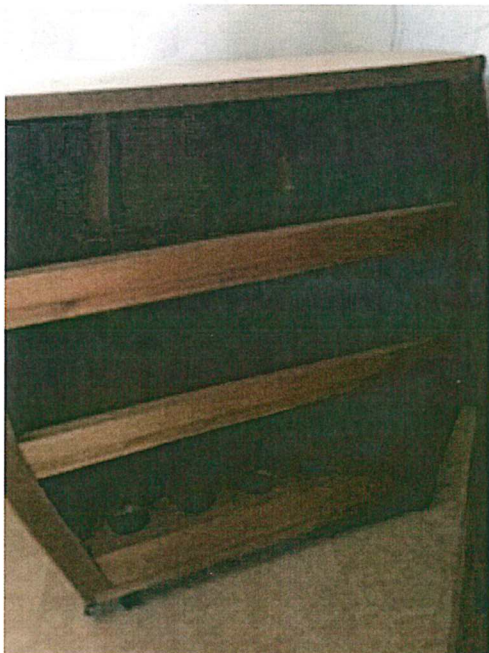
