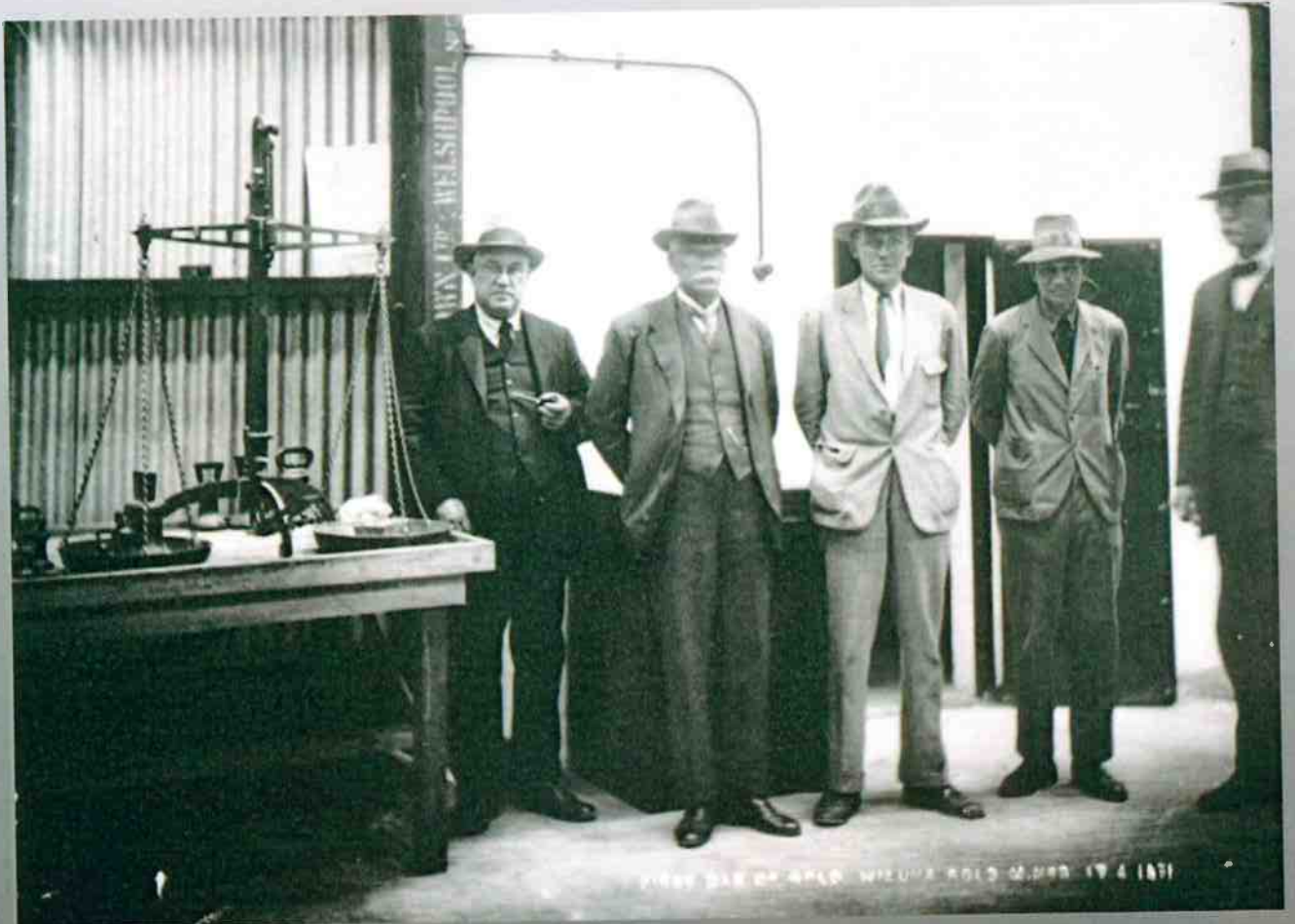

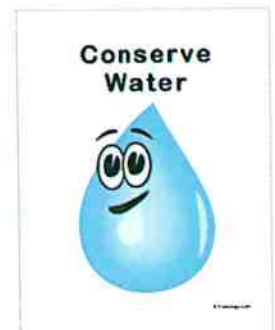

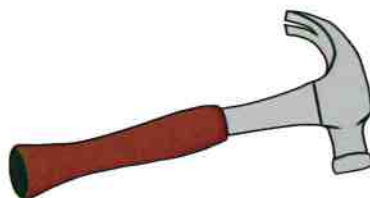

Beating Mosquitos



The Shire of Wiluna undertakes “fogging” against adult mosquitos, but this can never be fully effective in preventing mosquito bites.

Residents also need to help by reducing the opportunities for mosquitoes to breed, and for the eggs and larvae to develop into adult mosquitoes.

In addition, we all need to take some responsibility for minimising the risks of mosquito bites to ourselves and our families.

Mosquitoes aren’t just a nuisance – they can transmit serious diseases including Ross River and Barmah Forest viruses, Murray River encephalitis, Kunjin virus, dengue fever, chikungunya and Zika infections.

Wear appropriate clothing

Minimising the amount of exposed skin reduces the risk of mosquito bites. Wear loose, light-coloured clothing with long sleeves and pants. Also wear socks and shoes where possible.

Some mosquitoes will bite through clothing. Consider using clothing pre-treated with insecticides. Remember that repellent must still be applied to exposed skin.

Apply mosquito repellent to exposed skin

Use a mosquito repellent on all exposed skin areas. Reapply the repellent according to instructions or when you notice mosquitoes biting.

Avoid putting repellent near the eyes and mouth, or over open wounds, broken skin or abrasions. Always follow the product label instructions.

The most effective mosquito repellents contain Diethyl Toluamide (DEET) or Picaridin. Repellents containing oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) (also known as Extract of Lemon Eucalyptus) or para menthane diol (PMD) also provide adequate protection.

The strength of a repellent determines the duration of protection with the higher concentrations providing longer periods of protection. Always check the label for reapplication times.

Botanical-based products (such as Eucalyptus or Citronella) provide only limited protection and require frequent reapplication.

Use just enough repellent to cover exposed skin. After returning indoors, rinse off repellent with soap and water.

Mosquito repellent needs to be reapplied after swimming. The duration of protection from repellent is also reduced with perspiration, such as during strenuous activity or hot weather so it may need to be reapplied more frequently.

Use appropriate insecticides

Aerosol insecticide sprays, mosquito coils (used outdoors) and vapourising mats (used indoors) can help to clear rooms or areas of mosquitoes or repel mosquitoes from an area. These products should be used in addition to, not in place of, other measures such as appropriate clothing and skin repellents.

Take extra care during peak mosquito biting hours to reduce the risk of infection. Avoid the outdoors or take preventive actions (such as appropriate clothing and skin repellent). Most mosquitoes become active at dawn and dusk, and into the evening.

Reduce mosquito risk around the home

Stop adult mosquitoes entering the home by using flyscreens on windows and doors, and screening chimneys, vents and other entrances. Repair any damaged screens.

Consider also using a surface insecticide spray in areas where mosquitoes like to rest. During the day, mosquitoes rest and hide in cool shady areas such as in and around the home before emerging at dusk to feed. Make sure you avoid aquaria and fish ponds as fish are acutely sensitive to these insecticides.

Mosquitoes need water to breed and some mosquitoes can breed in very small amounts of water, such as in the water that collects in a discarded soft-drink can. Measures to reduce the risk of mosquitoes breeding in around the home include:

- cleaning up your backyard and removing all water-holding rubbish, including tires and containers
- keeping your lawns mowed
- flushing and wiping out bird baths and water features once a week.
- filling pot plant bases with sand to avoid standing water
- storing anything that can hold water undercover or in a dry place, and keeping bins covered
- flushing out the leaves of water-holding plants such as bromeliads once a week
- keeping drains and roof guttering clear to avoid standing water
- covering or securely screening the openings of septic tanks and rainwater tanks.

Be aware of the peak risk times for mosquito bites

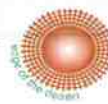

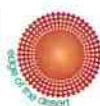

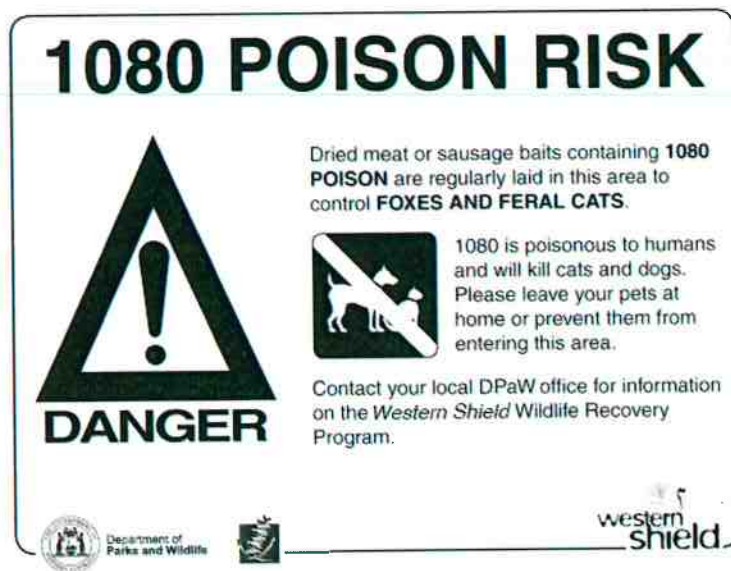
PET OWNERS BEWARE

Under the wildlife recovery program *Western Shield*, the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPaW) carries out 1080 fox and feral cat baiting operations on nearly three million hectares of land it manages.

The program is working to bring native animals back from the brink of extinction by controlling introduced predators such as the European red fox and feral cat.

As a result of baiting, many native animal species have increased in number or continue to persist in the wild.

**1080 is poisonous to humans and will kill
domestic cats and dogs.**



Pet owners please be aware that large areas of State forest, national parks and nature reserves are baited throughout the year and must be considered dangerous areas for pet dogs and cats at all times.

If visiting these areas it is advised that you leave your pets at home.

Do not take your pets into areas baited with 1080.

Baiting operations extend from Karratha in the north, through the forests of the south-west to areas east of Esperance.

All baited areas are signposted (see example above).

Pet owners are asked to observe 1080 warning signs and remain vigilant in preventing pets from entering baited areas.

1080 baits are made of meat and are extremely attractive to dogs who can detect the baits from many metres away. The baits will tempt both well-trained dogs and fussy eaters.

Please be aware that it is legal for DPaW and other neighbours to bait as close as five metres from your boundary and as close as 150 metres from your dwelling.

Pets can travel these distances very quickly.

Take your pet to a vet immediately if you suspect it has taken a bait.

Vomiting may be induced if there will be a reasonable delay in getting to a vet.

Be aware that it is not easy for an untrained person to make an animal vomit. If you do succeed in inducing vomiting the pet should still be taken to a vet as some poison could have been absorbed and the pet may not be out of danger.

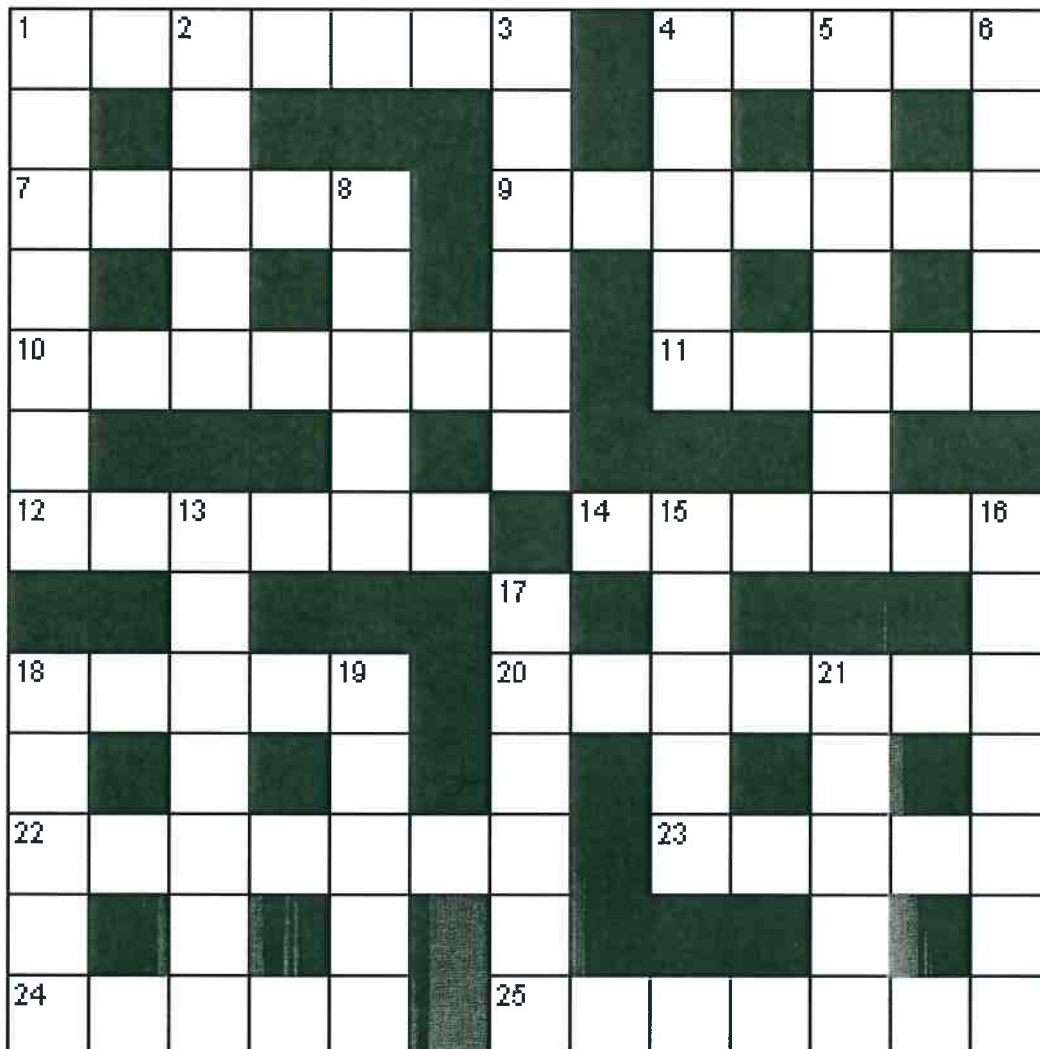

MEET THE ARTISTS OF TJUKURBA

She was born in the old Wiluna Hospital, and lives at Bondini. A number of her works are held in collections including the Water Corporation, the Aboriginal Medical Service and bhp billiton. One of her paintings was presented to the retired Governor General Michael Jeffrey on his visit to Wiluna in 2007. "It's a Dreamtime Story, it's where the Dingo had her pups.

When she got up and walked, she left one puppy behind. They travelled right up through the crossing to the claypan. They kept going through that lake. On the other side of the lake they travelled through to the ngulu (scary) place on the other side.

They kept going right up to that yupo (hill), the white hill on the side of the road "Yirrawarra". That's the hill where the Dingo has been crying since she lost her pup.

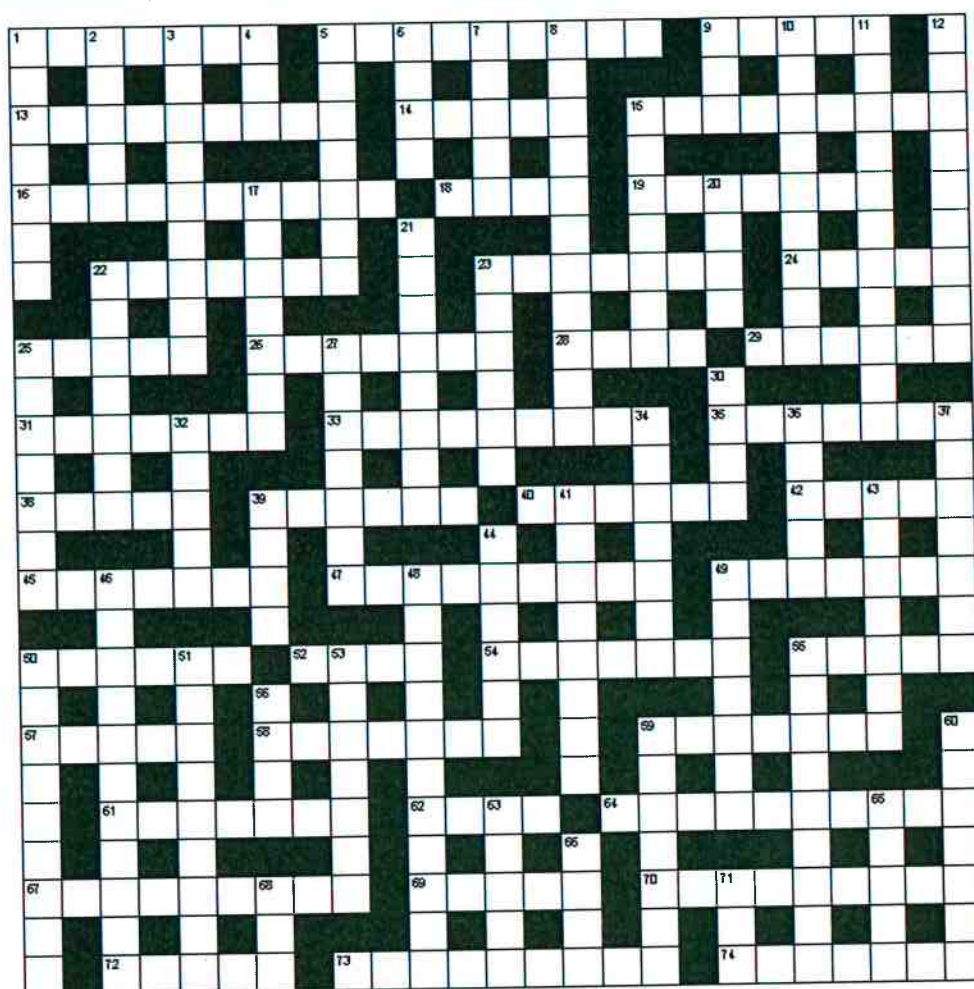

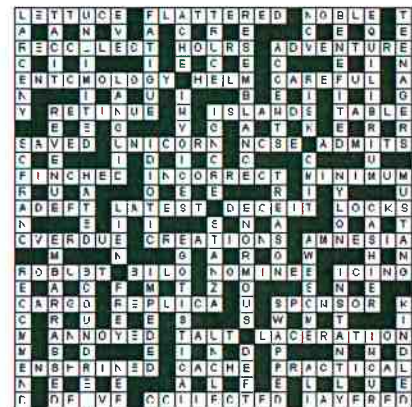
