Guiding you through separation

Lifeline WA is committed to supporting separated Mums and Dads, including LGBTIQA parents throughout WA. We offer individual counselling for parents before, during and after separation.

This free service is available to anyone in regional WA by video call (eg. Skype) or over the telephone.

Our counsellors provide one-on-one support to develop strategies to manage conflict and discuss and identify options and solutions. We can also refer to other support services relevant to individual family situations.

Lifeline WA does not provide legal advice but we can supply information on how to access legal advice where needed.

Our counselling team provides individual support and education for parents who want to:

- Negotiate shared care arrangements for their children
- Communicate effectively with the other parent
- Be prepared for mediation and to better understand the mediation process
- Understand the complexities of the Family Court and the legal system
- Access practical and emotional support and assistance
- Create a parenting plan designed to specifically meet the needs of their children

Information and resources for help seekers and care givers.



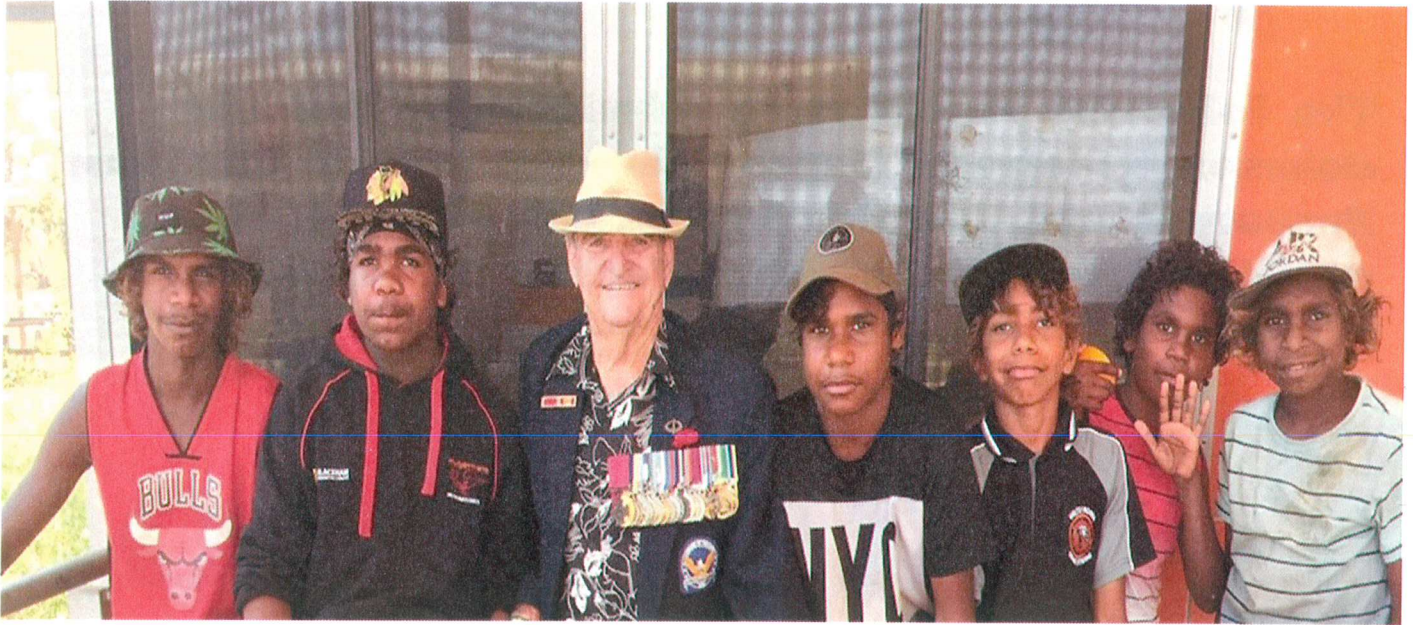

VC Hero Inspires Students

A visit from an inspiring war hero this week coincided with the celebration of 15 students in a remote community in Wiluna who completed their first TAFE certificates.

The Wiluna Remote Community School Training Centre was established in June in partnership with the Shire of Wiluna and the Department of Education.

In that time the centre has overseen 15 students complete 22 courses through Central Regional TAFE — 15 in Certificate I in Automotive Training and seven in Conservation and Land Management.

Victoria Cross recipient Keith Payne visited the community on Monday, with close friend and training centre co-ordinator Mac Jensen, to meet students and see what the small community was able to achieve.

Mr Jensen said the war veteran was a strong advocate for Aboriginal training, education and employment and was a source of inspiration for the students.

“Keith and I are very similar people, we regard it as a great privilege to be welcomed into another culture,” he said.

“We believe everyone deserves a fair go and, not that people aren’t trying, but it is very difficult to achieve equal opportunities living in a remote community.

“The more and more remote you get, the gap widens in education and employment opportunities. We believe in bridging that gap and we are able to do that.

“Wins are hard to come by, but when you do, like these certificates, it is an amazing sense of achievement.”

CRT lecturers from Kalgoorlie visited the community for one week each month during the school term.



PROPOSAL TO WIND-UP THE WILUNA LAND CONSERVATION DISTRICT COMMITTEE

Public comment is invited in relation to the proposed wind-up of the Wiluna Land Conservation District Committee (LCDC).

LCDC's are statutory bodies formed under section 23 of the *Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945*. Their functions include undertaking land conservation works, promoting soil conservation programs and providing advice to the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development on land use issues within their districts.

The LCDC is proposed to be abolished because of lack of interest.

If you wish to comment on this proposal, please write to the Commissioner by 30 December 2017. All comments received will be presented to the Minister for Agriculture and Food before the LCDC is formally wound-up.

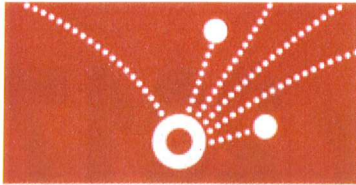

Christmas Recipies

Cheat's Christmas Shortbread

This simple shortbread recipe is as buttery and melt-in-the-mouth as any fancy traditional recipe. Whip up a batch and wrap them for Christmas.

Makes: 24 Prep: 0.10min Cook: 0.35



Ingredients

- 125g Caster Sugar
- 125g Cornflour
- 2 Cups of Plain Flour
- 250g Butter

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 170 °C.
2. Mix all the dry ingredients in a bowl. Add the melted butter and stir until it's all combined.
3. Line a 28cm x 18cm lamington tin with baking paper and press the mixture in.
4. Bake at 170° for 30 minutes.
5. Remove from oven, cut into 24 squares, sprinkle evenly with caster sugar and prick each piece with a fork.
6. Return to the oven for 15 minutes. Cool in the tin.



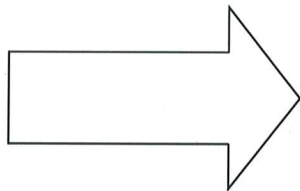
Notes

Don't skip the final step of cutting and returning the Shortbread to the oven.

The objective is to fill a 9×9 grid with digits so that each column, each row, and each of the nine 3×3 subgrids that compose the grid contains all of the digits from 1 to 9. The puzzle setter provides a partially completed grid, which for a well-posed puzzle has a unique solution.

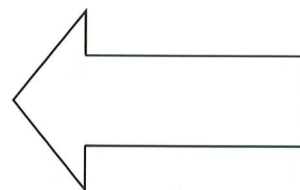
