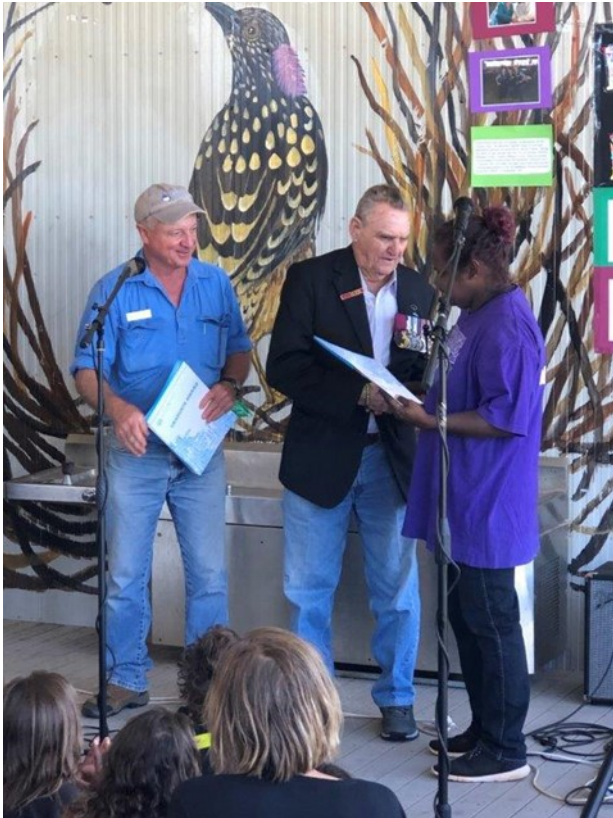

How to Prepare for a Holiday Road Trip

If like many people, you're planning to hit the road this Easter break, then you should know that research shows it's better to have a good night's sleep before you set off.

Recent research has found that getting a good night's sleep before you hit the holiday can make a world of difference when it comes to safety. A survey of 4,097 Australian drivers found that a frightening 1 in 5 have admitted to falling asleep at the wheel.

Easter is one of the busiest times of the year for road accidents. Easter, like most holidays, has always been a bad time for road deaths in Australia.

Tips to Avoid Crashing this Easter Break

- ◆ **Get a good night's sleep in the days leading up to your journey. Young drivers aged 18 to 24 years old are the drivers most likely to drive tired**
- ◆ **Avoid beginning a trip at the end of a day's work, or driving at times when you would normally be asleep, such as very early in the morning**
- ◆ **Take a break and stretch your legs every 2 hours, and swap drivers if you can**
- ◆ **It is dangerous to rely on caffeine, energy drinks, and loud music—stopping to sleep is a much better solution**
- ◆ **Slow down while driving at night, particularly in the country, as animals and other hazards are infinitely harder to spot in the dark**
- ◆ **Avoid distractions. Parents in particular are urged to be cautious during Easter time, as roughly two thirds say their children have distracted them from concentrating on the road at least once. Distractions can include kicking the seat, fighting with siblings, playing noisily and playing loud music. Children on road trips will inevitably become restless, so it's important to plan ahead and schedule regular stops to stretch their legs and take a breather. It's also a good idea to have some car-friendly games or activities to keep them occupied.**
- ◆ **Don't be impatient. Driving can be frustrating at times, drivers can easily fall victim to their own impatience when a lack of sleep and traffic jams are added into the mix. Allow plenty of time to get to your destination.**

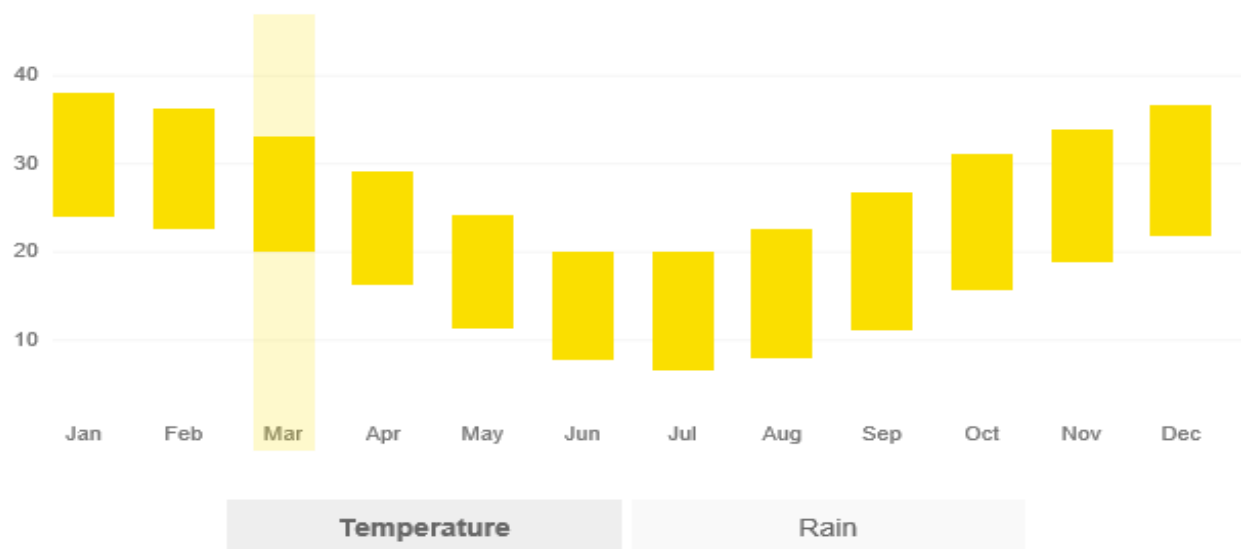

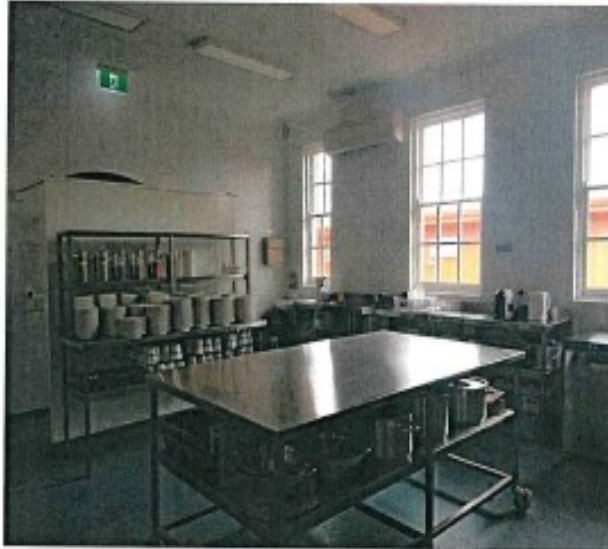

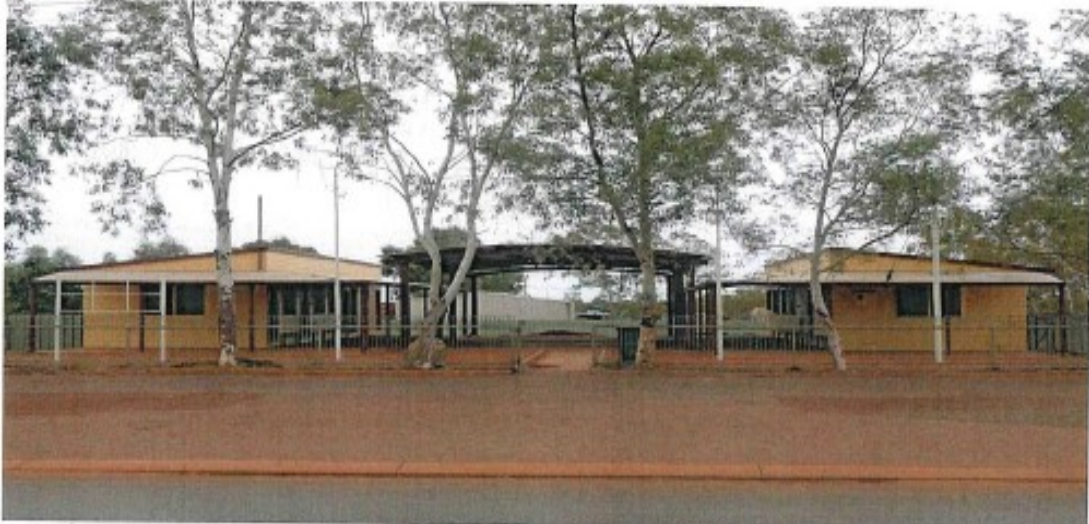

21 ANZAC Day Facts

ANZAC Day has arrived again, so I thought I would share some interesting and frequently unknown facts about ANZACS and Anzac Day, so we can understand why we honour this national day.



- The ANZACs were all volunteers.
- April 25, Anzac Day, was the day the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula in 1915,
- 25 April, was officially named ANZAC Day in 1916.
- The first dawn service on an ANZAC Day was in 1923.
- AIF is an abbreviation for the Australian Imperial Force.
- There is no town called "Gallipoli". It is the name of an area. Visitors to Gallipoli usually stay at nearby towns like Eceabat.
- ANZAC Day was not a public holiday in New Zealand until 1921.
- ANZAC Day was not a public holiday in Australia until 1921. However it was not observed uniformly in all the states.
- The Gallipoli Peninsula is very near the famous ancient city of Troy.
- The term ANZAC is protected under Australian Law.
- More than 11,000 ANZACs died at Gallipoli and more than 23,000 were wounded.
- Services are held at dawn because in battle, dawn was the best time to attack the enemy, and soldiers would wake in the dark so the first signs of light they were alert and awake.
- The original Anzac biscuit was known as an Anzac wafer or tile and was part of the rations given to the ANZAC soldiers during World War I. They were included instead of bread because they had a much longer shelf life.
- Anzac biscuits were created by wives of soldiers who wanted to bake healthy goodies for their men. They lacked egg and milk, so they kept for a long time and didn't spoil during transport.
- The poppy as a symbol comes from Canadian John McCrae's WWI poem. In Flanders Field. It was used as a symbol by the Canadians for their Remembrance Day, and has been adapted as a reminder of the loss of all

- The wearing of rosemary on ANZAC Day is done as a mark of respect for the men who never returned from Gallipoli or indeed, later wars. The wearing of it honours the memory of those brave men.
- The “Last Post” is incorporated into funeral and memorial services as a final farewell and symbolizes that the duty of the dead is over and that they can rest in peace.
- The men who served on the Gallipoli Peninsula created a legend, adding the word ‘ANZAC’ to our vocabulary and creating the idea of the ANZAC spirit.
- In Tonga, Samoa, Cook Islands and Niue, ANZAC Day is also commemorated to honour their soldiers who participated in the campaign.
- ANZAC Day is commemorated in France in the towns of Le Quesnoy and Longueval.
- ANZAC Day is commemorated in the village of Harefield in Middlesex just outside of London because of a quirk in history. In 1914, millionaire Sydney expat Charles Billyard-Leake offered his manor home and 250 acres of parkland for injured Australian troops to recoup. It was imagined 50 soldiers in winter, 150 in summer would be catered for. But by the following year and post Gallipoli, it had become a fully-fledged hospital with 1000 beds just for Australian soldiers. More than 50,000 wounded Diggers passed through the home, which became known as Number 1 Australian Auxiliary Hospital.

History of Anzac biscuits

As most people are aware the Anzac biscuit was sent by wives, girlfriends and women's groups to soldiers abroad because the ingredients do not spoil easily and they kept well during navel transportation. The transport ships travelled at a maximum of ten knots, or 18.5 kph and refrigeration was not installed until World War II on many Merchant Ships.

Most family recipes tell a story, but none so much, or with as much mystery still surrounding it, as the Anzac biscuit.

Historian Allison Reynolds has been trawling through old recipe books trying to discover the origins of this famous Australian snack.

It seems that Anzac biscuits weren't called this before 1914, because that's when the acronym came in after Gallipoli.

The first version of this rolled oat based biscuit reportedly appeared around 1823, and over the next century took on various names such as "surprise biscuits" and "crispies".

Around the early years of World War 1 there appeared to be a name change to "red cross biscuits" and "soldier biscuits".

These biscuits were used as a form of fundraising, so they gave them a war connected name which helped sell them.

The first printed 'Anzac biscuit' recipe was traced back to an Australian publication called the *War Chest Cookery Book* published in 1917.

However, whilst this recipe used the famous biscuit title, it didn't resemble the recipe as we know it today.

This recipe contained eggs, and the method was different and the biscuits were sandwiched together with jam and cream. So it can not really be called the first Anzac biscuit, even though it was call an Anzac biscuit.

It started off in a recipe book in 1910, but then when the war years came from 1915 it got used at the back to record the sales of butter and eggs.

The information stopped in 1920 so it is thought the recipe is circa 1919.

But there was one thing still missing from this recipe, coconut and it was in a 1924 Adelaide booklet that the most enduring recipe of the Anzac biscuit was found.

Currently the first recipe with coconut was in the 1924 *Anchor Ann* cookbook and that is the recipe that is nearest to the recipe that we know today.

Anzac Biscuits

Ingredients

- * 2 level cups/200g/6oz rolled Oats
- * 1 level cup/125g/4 1/2 oz plain flour
- * 1/4 cup/105g/5 1/2 oz granulated sugar
- * 125g/4 1/2 oz butter, cubed
- * 1 extra generous Tablespoon golden syrup
- * 1tsp bicarbonate of soda
- * 2 tbsp boiling water

Method

Pre-set oven 170f/150c, and line two baking trays with baking paper,

Put the oats, flour and sugar into a large bowl and mix well.

Melt butter in a large bot over medium heat, dip tablespoon in hot water and then use to measure the golden syrup, stil till dissolved and just coming to the boil— remove from heat source (but don't allow to cool).

Stir the bicarbonate of soda with the measured boiling water until its dissolved then add to the pan of hot melted butter and golden syrup.

Stir until it “froths up” - immediately add to the dry ingredients and mix together.

Roll into balls the size of a walnut and place on the prepared

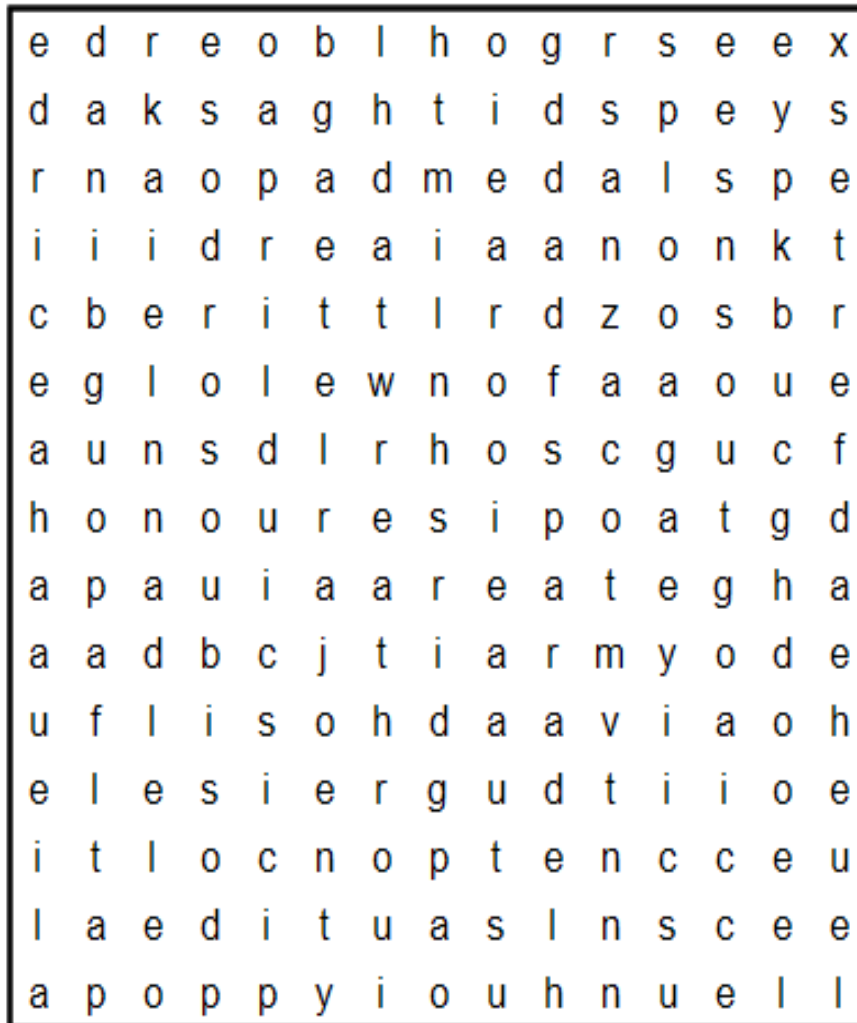
The biscuits need to be flattened slightly - use the ase of a glass or, press down with a fork dipped in a little flour (they will be soft)

Leave the biscuits on the trays for 5 minutes before transferring them to a cooling rack. When the biscuits are cold store them in a container.



Anzac Day Word Search

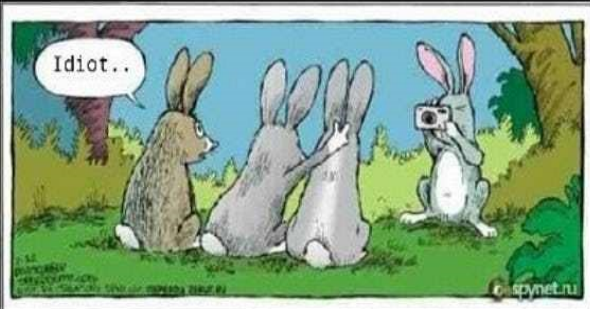

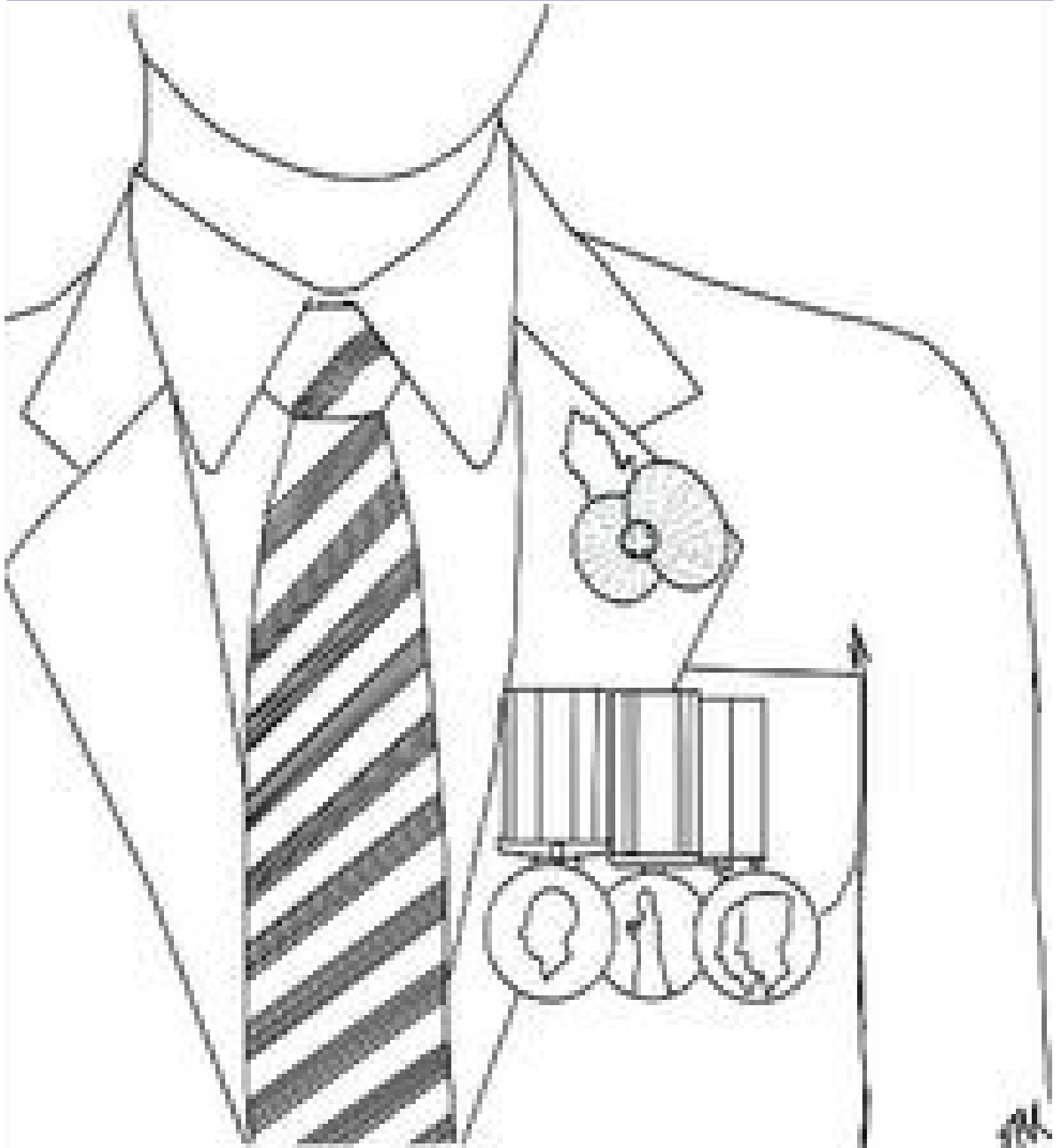
