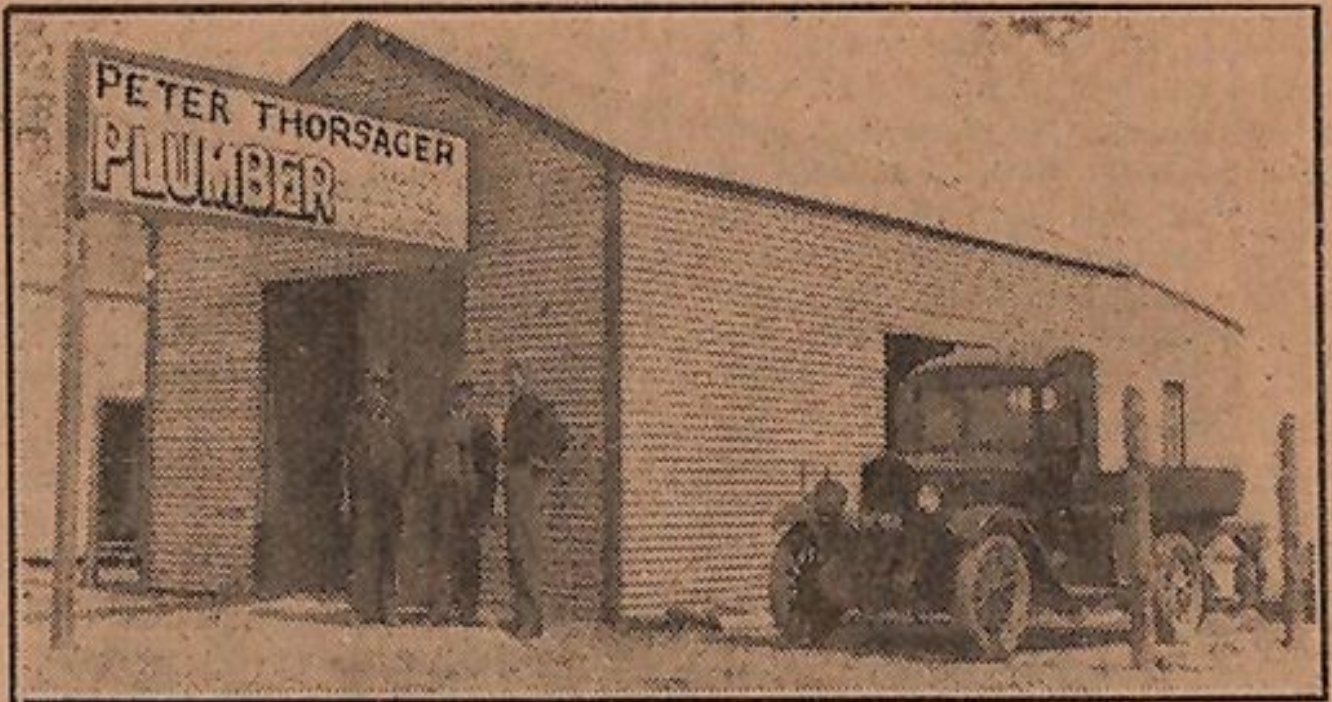

CEO's Report

The Shire and Wiluna Police have teamed up to reduce and remove graffiti in Wiluna. As the Shire is continuing to advance the beautification program of the Wiluna townsite the issue of graffiti needs to be addressed.

The Stage 1 renovation of Wotton Street is expected to commence in the coming weeks. The plans of the proposed renovation works can be inspected in the Shire Office during normal working office hours.

Council will be holding a Special Council Meeting (SCM) on the 14 August 2019, to consider this year's budget. Some of the major projects that have been included in the DRAFT Budget, is the Main Street Renovation, Construction of Memorial Park and Playground Facility. There is also funding from a community-based project that will focus on paving the outside of the Youth Centre. More details on the community project will be provided shortly.

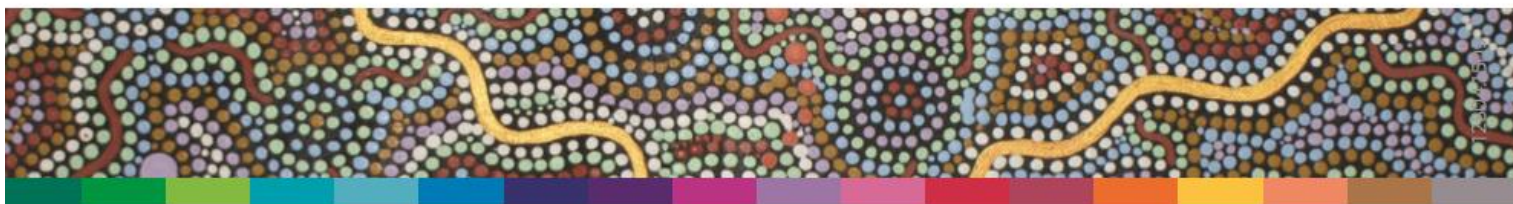

Australian HF Touring Club Incorporated

“Aussie HF” as we are colloquially known, is a club that has been established for the safety and social contact of members who travel throughout the remote and outback regions of Australia and venture beyond the range of established telephone services. Our members have long-range high frequency (HF) radios installed in their motor vehicles, mobile homes caravans and fifth-wheelers.

As Club members they have the ability to make telephone calls, send SMS messages, long their GPS positions and have direct contact with the Royal Flying Doctor Service in the event of assistance being required by themselves or other road users. These services are provided free of charge to members through a network of remotely operated base stations throughout Australia and one of these bases has recently been relocated to Wiluna from Perth.

In addition to the core services mentioned, Aussie HF also provides access to automated ABC News headlines and ABC weather forecasts through these bases that information may be retrieved by anyone, member and non-member who used the appropriate access code.

A further service the Club wishes to provide to the travelling public and remote communities is an up-to-date, and daily road conditions report for some of the recognised complex unsealed routes such as the Canning Stock Route, Gibb River Road, Great Central Highway and the Tanami Track. In order to realise this project AHFTC will require assistance of the local councils who are prepared to allocate a minimal amount of time for data collection and posting to the system.

It is envisaged that for a new minutes at the start and completion of each working day a council employee will obtain the necessary road condition report from the service providers (eg RACWA) internet site and phone it through to the Aussie HF automated recording facility. This task should not be very labour intensive and information should only be posted when it has been amended or updated. The pre-amble to this service will include advise of the source of the information and that it is for guidance purposes only and is planned for the recognised tourist season only, unless an extension is required.

The AHFTC is seeking the support of the Wiluna Shire Council to introduce this service for areas of Western Australia and should the council agree to assist with this service they will be providing an invaluable safety-net to travellers in WA.

By assisting with provision of this service the Council will be brining a focus on the Wiluna area and enhancing the tourism potential that will accompany the heightened exposure of the region.

In addition to the Road Condition Reports, the AHFTC Wiluna base, and all other Club bases throughout Australia, will be available to commercial and government bodies within the Wiluna area who may wish to have access to our services and facilities providing they make suitable application for this access. We are already partnering with an international Perth based communications group who are using AHFTC service and there remains ample scope for additional users on our system.

We trust that the Wiluna Shire Council will see the merits and benefits in partnering with our Club to provide this essential and readily accessible information service.

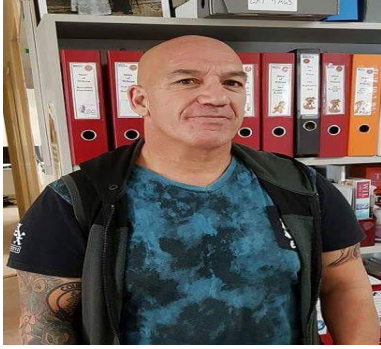

Storm Co spent their week in town assisting with the morning art and dance program, in the afternoon the Storm Co team spent time with the children yarnning and singing, the highlight of the afternoons had to be Elmo from Sesame Street, who always travels up to Wiluna with the Storm Co. We held our first Blue Boys Disco on Thursday 11th July. We started the afternoon off with the Elmo show from there the Storm Co kids started a face painting workshop. Once the children had their faces painted we hit the dance floor.

Having a group of teenagers in town mingling and interacting with the local children give us all new experiences and people to meet, thank you all for making the long trip up to visit and share your time and energy. Being able to tell our young people that the Storm Co group (children) raised their own personal funds to come up here and spend their holiday time is a subtle way to show everyone that we don't always need a hand to get somewhere, we just need the drive and energy to make it happen..

Awesome Creative Challenge:

Sete and Addam spent the term break running morning art, craft and dance movement program, the program was full on throughout the two week program. The children were fully engaged as the creative juices started to flow. The morning sessions started with dance and stretching movements to warm up the body and mind, once completed the art and craft started. The key to building champion young people is having time for them, in life it can take one person to make a change in someone if you have the time, walk down to the oval with your children and help Roy the Footy Man to discover the next big thing in footy. Who knows how many champions are running around the Wiluna Oval.

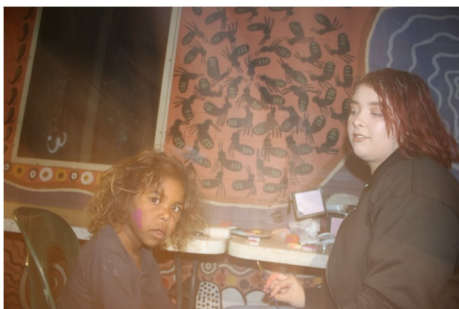


Blue Boys Disco and Community BBQ

Having family members down to spend time and see what their babies were up to, shows me that we are all working in the right direction to make Wiluna a place that does cater for its youngsters. To all the children and locals who attended thank you for your time and energy.

Without the support of people and service providers community activities are never as successful, when the children see you all outside of work or home it builds a different relationship and shows we care. To the Wiluna Police, NAHS, Shire workers, Storm Co, Creative Challenge, and the locals from the church and town through your efforts we all had an awesome night while the children laughed and danced the night away.



Flash Back to 1936

WILUNA CROSSING SMASH TWO KILLED AND FIVE INJURED TAXI SMASHES INTO RAIL TANK

The already long list of level crossing fatalities was added to yet again last night, when two persons were killed and five others injured when an engine, preceded by a water tank, collided with a taxi car at the Red Hill level crossing about a mile from Wiluna Mines. The victims were: -



Albert Pethon WESTGARTH (61), an underground mine worker who received a fractured skull and multiple injuries (died on the way to hospital), James Farrell READ (18), a miner who also received a fractured skull, head and body injuries (died this morning). Injured was Saul WARNE (67) a mine carpenter, who was treated for a dislocated hip and shock, Salvatore LOCICERO (38) taxi owner was treated for body injuries and shock. Michael Gibbon BEAUMONT (26), a draftsman was treated for a possible fracture to the base of the skull



and shock. Ethel MCKAY, a domestic was treated for a broken leg, fingers and ribs and shock. Cecil Percy PORT, a guard was treated for abrasions and shock who was riding on the tender, he was struck by coal, and was thrown 20 feet onto the road.



The Engine crew escaped with a severe shaking. An engine and a water tank were returning last night at about 8.30 o'clock after taking oil tankers and material to Wiluna Mines. When passing over Red Hill crossing, about a mile from the mine, the water tank, which was in front of the engine, struck a taxi driven by Salvatore LOCICERO and carrying five passengers.

The impact was terrific, the car being thrown down almost parallel with the engine on the western side of the embankment and being smashed to pieces. The tank left the rails, turning around and resting practically overturned on the same side, badly damaged. The tender left the rails on the opposite side. The occupants were seriously injured. The Wiluna Mines ambulance was summoned immediately and removed the worst cases to hospital. So far no definite information as to the cause of the smash has been obtained.

The railroad between the mines and the station runs in a slightly north-west direction towards the town. Visibility both ways was good, there being no obstruction to prevent road traffic from detecting the approach of trains for some distance. The country is practically level, but owing to heavy traffic and dry weather, the dust was extremely thick. The turning of the road at this crossing is said to be regarded by motorists as difficult.

Doctor Alfred Johnston and the Police were quickly on the scene and all did much worthy work to assist the sufferers.



The following Information was supplied a relative of James Farrell READ.

James was the second eldest son of Charlotte and Mark (dec) Read of Northampton. James's second name was in memory of his mother's brother, James Farrell who was killed in 1917 on the Western Front during World War One. Then in 1928 at the age of 10 James's father died.

James was an excellent scholar but unfortunately the family could not afford for him to stay in the education system. With the onset of the depression in 1929, times were hard. More than 21% of Australian were unemployed in the mid 30's and at time much higher. Desperate to find work and contribute to the family's income, James had travelled from Claremont near Perth to find work.

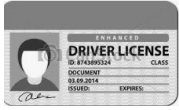
He finally found employment at the Wiluna Gold Mine, and according to his mother, was happy to be working. Around 9.00 pm on the 31st March 1936 he was in a Taxi with 4 other passengers heading to work. Unfortunately, the taxi he was traveling in collided with a reversing train.

James was severely injured and died the following day in hospital. He was only 18 and buried in the Wiluna Cemetery. Sadly his mother wasn't aware of his death for several weeks due to errors in the paper. The report had him as much older than his 18 years of age and his second name was incorrect. She sensed something was wrong as she hadn't heard from him, as he normally wrote several times a week. In an effort to locate her son she asked the Mother Superior at Northampton if she had heard anything. Eventually word came that James had been killed.

The Taxi Driver, Salvatore LOCICERO, was committed to Perth court on the 2 June next on a charge of manslaughter. Bail was fixed at a personal bond of 200 Pounds and two sureties of 100 pounds each. It is not known the outcome of the trial, but it is believed he was acquitted as two years later he applied for Citizenship.

My other work, *Collecting Malga Seeds*, depicts the Seven Sisters collecting the Malga Seeds and the Pricker bush seeds. Malga wood is used to dig out the seeds that sit among the different colours of the Country Landscape.

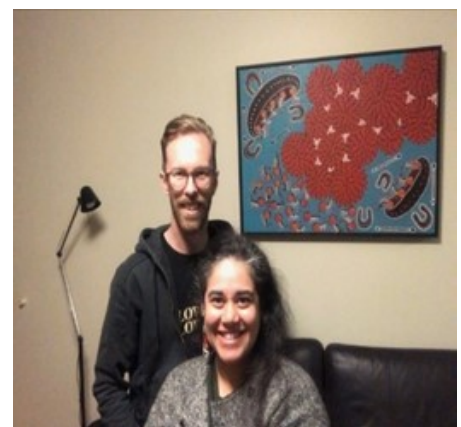

Changes to the Pensioner Free Travel Scheme

To Pensioners in the community you will be affected by changes to the management of the WA Pensioner Free Travel Scheme.

Information is being sent direct to pensioners when their concession cards are renewed, to previous users of Transwa's pensioner free travel and is available on the websites of Transwa and other agencies (such as ConcessionsWA, Department of Veterans' Affairs and the Department of Human Services).

What will change?

The paper **WA Free Travel vouchers** issued with Pensioner Concession Card renewals will stop from the end of December 2019.

Free Travel entitlements on Transwa services will remain and from January 2020 will be managed electronically by Transwa and issued for travel within each eligible calendar year. Before booking with Transwa each WA pensioner must be registered so their concession and entitlement details can be verified and their electronic entitlement established.

Pensioners living above the 26th parallel will still apply to the Department of Transport for access to eligible air or private coach transport (transport.wa.gov.au/aboutus/pensioner-free-trip-scheme.asp)

How do Pensioners Register for Free Travel?

Pensioners can complete and return the Pensioner Free Travel Registration Form on Pages 30 and 31 to Transwa, Reply Paid 85335, Locked Bag 7, PERTH WA 6849.

Registration forms will be sent with Pensioner Concession Card Renewals and to known Transwa customers or can be downloaded from the Transwa website.

Alternatively, pensioners can register online at transwa.wa.gov.au-Pensioner-Free-Travel

Pensioners are encouraged to register as soon as possible to ensure their 2020 free travel entitlement is allocated when they become available for booking in October 2019.

Pensioner Free Travel - FAQs

1 I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

2 I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

3 How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the [online registration form](#) and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s). Alternatively download and print the [registration form \(PDF\)](#), complete and send to Transwa with photocopies of both sides of your card.

4 What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accept either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession. When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card. You can also screenshot your digital wallet and send us the image with your online registration form.

5 Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

6 How do I book my pensioner free travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

7 What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

8 Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

Pensioner Free Travel - FAQs

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

9 Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?


In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim a 50% concession on all Transwa services.

10 Am I entitled to other travel entitlements if I live in the north of Western Australia?

If you live north of the 26th parallel in Western Australia and hold a Pensioner Concession Card or DVA Gold Health Card you may be entitled to other free travel options. Visit the [Department of Transport](#) for more details.


11 Do I need travel insurance?

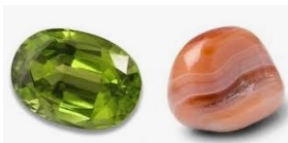

Simple Kangaroo Curry



Ingredients

- 600 g kangaroo meat, diced
- 2 tbs curry powder
- 2 beef stock cubes
- 2 cups water
- 1 large potato, peeled and diced
- 2 carrots
- 1 1/2 large onions, peeled and diced
- 1/2 cup of frozen peas
- 3 cloves garlic, crushed
- lemon juice
- 1 tbs cornflour

Method

1. Place kangaroo chunks in pot with curry powder and cook for $\frac{3}{4}$ of an hour in own juices until meat has browned.
2. Put stock cubes in water and stir. Add to the pot and mix well.
3. Add potato, onion, and half the garlic. Mix well and cook for 15 – 20 minutes.
4. Add lemon juice, pinch of salt, and the remaining garlic.
5. Add a tablespoon of cornflour to thicken.
6. Cook until the potatoes are tender
7. Add frozen peas at the end

1/2 cup low fat milk

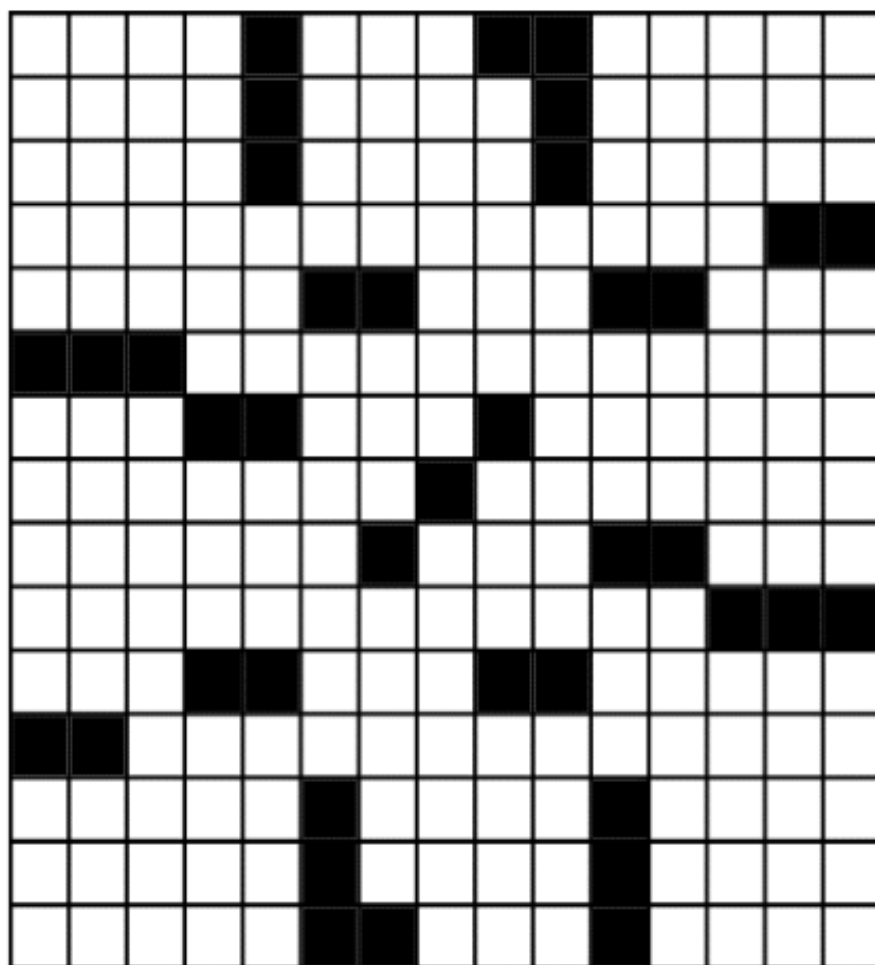
Method
