## Acting CEO's Report

### ***Happy New Year to all !!***

We welcome the rain back to Wiluna.

It is great to see the land greening up a bit (and to escape the constant dust for a while).

A wonderful thing for our pastoralists who have suffered a very severe drought these past two years (euphemistically called "an extended dry spell"), and a life-saver for thousands of animals (both livestock and wildlife).



**So let's be grateful for our blessings**

## **BUT**

- The rainfall received in the wake of Ex-Tropical Cyclone Blake was more than the parched land (and our road infrastructure) could handle.
- Carnegie Station is reported to have recorded the wettest 24-hour total since records began in 1942 of 270mm, which according to the Bureau of Meteorology is close to a 1-in-1000 year rainfall event.
- Granite Peak is estimated to have received approximately 150mm of rain in about 15 hours, compared to 105mm over the preceding 23 months.
- At least one homestead was inundated with 10 inches of water, and there has been lot a lot damage to our roads.

The Shire is contacting pastoral stations in the area to collect data on the number of people trapped on stations by floodwaters, and the adequacy of their supplies of food, fuel and medicines. This information is being reported to the Department of Fire and Emergency Services so that supply drops can be arranged where necessary.

The much larger and longer task will be assessing and repairing the roads in the Shire. The Shire of Wiluna is responsible for maintenance of 1,832 kms of unsealed roads, many of which are currently impassable.

The roads that have so far been inspected are showing very severe damage, but it will take some time to assess all the roads, document the damage, prepare detailed cost estimates, and get approval to commence repairs.

As a first step, Shire President Jim Quadrio has called on the state government to declare a natural disaster in the Shire and the Officers have already made a submission 10 days ago.



But we have not yet received a formal declaration.

In any case, we ask everyone to be patient and realistic with regard to the necessary road repairs – we will be getting on with the job as quickly as we can, but right now we can't even get around to get a comprehensive assessment of all the damage.

In due course we will be able to open up all the roads.

But these initial "opening-up" works will be just that (most likely a single cut with a grader in the first instance). More permanent repairs will have to await due process including funding approvals and the award of contracts for the work.

### **2019 was a great year for Tjukurba Gallery**

Congratulations to our Birriliburu Artists and to Linaire and her team – now that 2019 is completed we can say that the Art Centre and the Artists have had the best year since 2014 and one of the Art Centre's best 4 years ever!

The Council adopted a business plan for the Art Centre at its December 2018 meeting, and it has fallen mainly to Linaire and other Shire staff to implement the plan in 2019. Here are the results:

- Highest number of artwork sales since 2014 (number of sales above the long-term average)
- Highest total value of artwork sales since 2013 (value of sales well above the long-term average)

The Artists and the Shire staff have walked together on a steep learning curve in 2019 to find how to implement the new business plan for the best outcomes. As a result of our learning experience, we can expect to achieve even better results in 2020.

# Major Flooding on Shire Roads

Rain from Tropical Cyclone Blake caused major disruption to the Shire of Wiluna road network.

Over 300ml of rain was recorded and has caused considerable damage to the Shire road network, with many roads still closed and the ones that are open are to be used with caution or are only able to be used by Station traffic.

Some of the roads that are still closed had over a 2km stretch of water flowing across them.

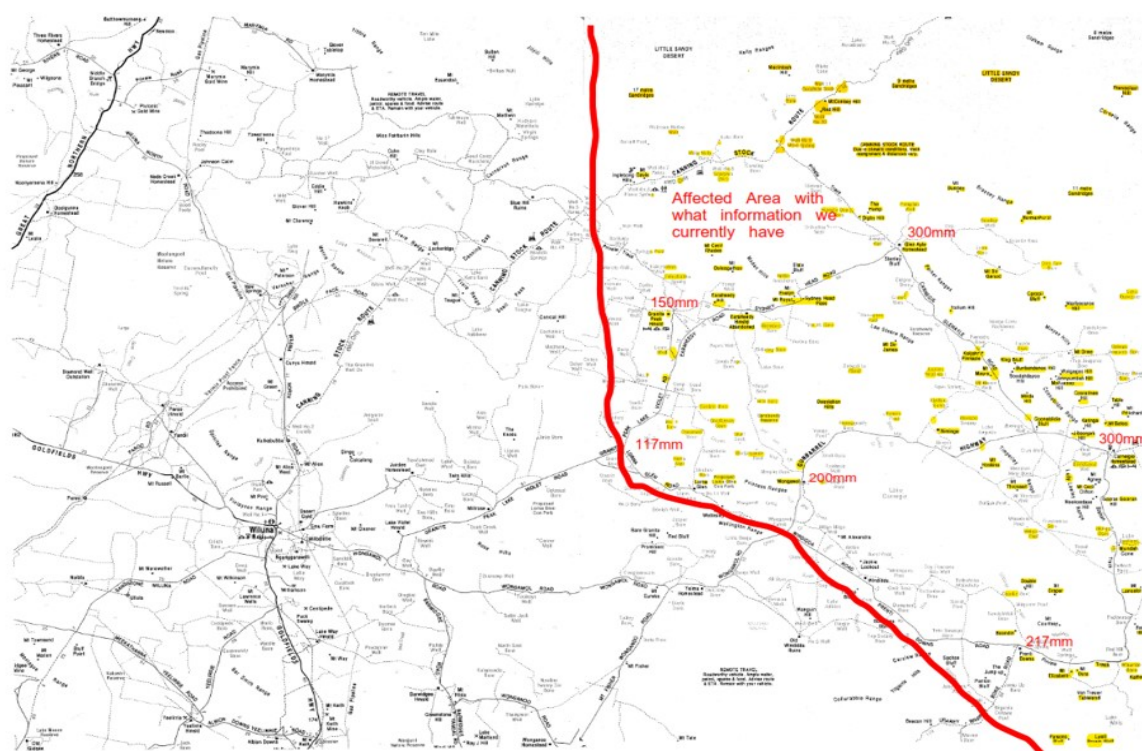
Youno Downs reported 269mm of rain, with part of the homestead being inundated with about 10 inches of water.

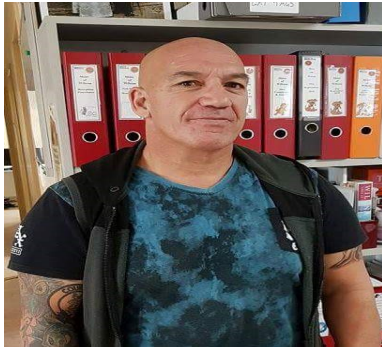
Mr Ward from Glen Ayle reported that the main crossing between Glen-Ayle and Granite Peak, was flooded with water up to 4m high. Sydney Heads Road is unpassable.

Carnegie Station reported over 308mm of rain and they were unable to travel far from the Homestead, because there was water in every direction, and Prenti Downs was flooded.

We would deem the Eastern side of the Shire unsafe for the General Public at this point.

## ***Ranger Stacey News***

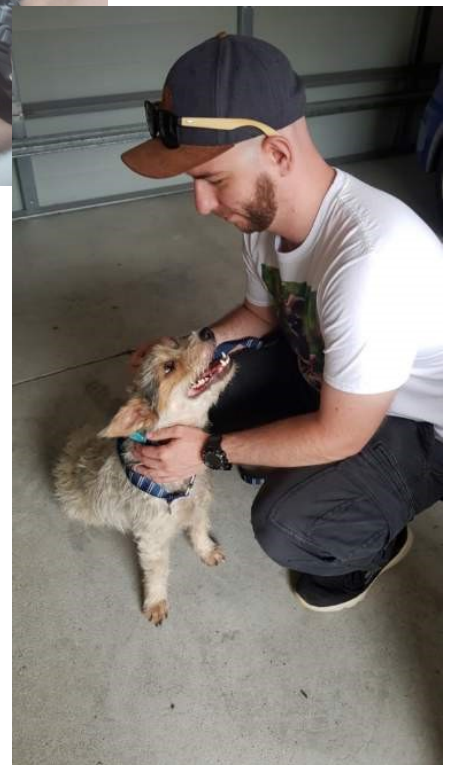

# *Don't Forget to Register Your Dog or Cat*

## **Register your cat or dog**

### **Dog Registration**

- Dogs aged 3 months and over must be registered and microchipped
- Proof of sterilization is required to be submitted with your application form
- Households are limited to 2 dogs

### **Cat Registration**

- Cats 6 months and over must be registered
- Cats must be microchipped and sterilized

### **Registration Period and Renewals**

- The registration period is from 1 November 2019 to 31 October 2020
- 1 year and 3 year animal registrations expire 31 October regardless of the month your animal is registered. (Any 1 year new annual registrations purchased from the 1 June to 31 October, the fee payable is half the normal price as the registration will expire on the 31 October of that same year).

### **Fees Payable**

Pensioner concession of 50% applies to holders of a current Pension Concession card or either a Centrelink or Department of Veteran Affairs "Commonwealth Seniors Health Card" together with a Seniors Card must be provided to claim concession.

### Native Title Land Access Agreement Executed for Lake Way Project

On 20 November 2019, SO4 and Tarlka Matuwa Piarku (Aboriginal Corporation) RNTBC (TMPAC) executed the Native Title Land Access Agreement (LAA) for the whole of the Lake Way Project.

SO4 has been working collaboratively with TMPAC to finalise the landmark LAA.



The LAA provides benefits to SO4 and TMPAC. SO4 receives tenure and native title approval security for the duration of the Project, and TMPAC and the broader Wiluna Community with significant economic, social, environmental, and cultural heritage management benefits.

SO4 is proud to deliver lasting benefits to the community in collaboration with our TMPAC partners, who strongly represent and support their people, culture and country.

## Our Project

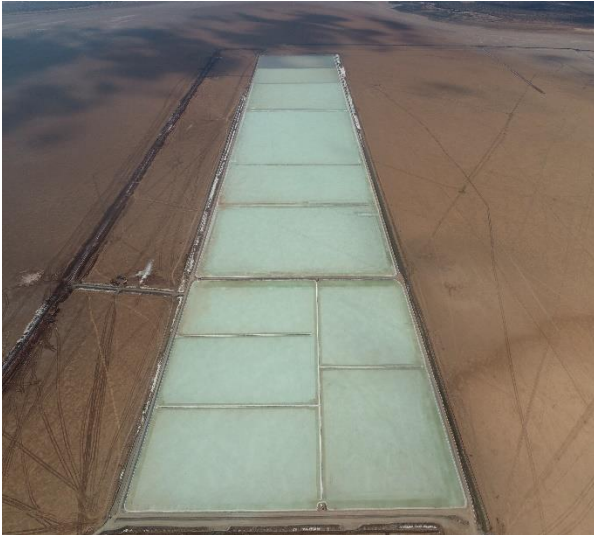
SO4 is developing its first operation at Lake Way where potassium rich brine will be abstracted and used to produce a high quality, premium grade sulphate of potash fertiliser.

SO4 has nine lake tenements in the Goldfields region, with ultimate plans to produce premium, organic SOP from the portfolio of sites. Utilising the nine lakes in an integrated operation would realise a globally significant SOP resource, capable of sustaining an extensive operation for multiple generations.

## Project Progress

SO4 has constructed the Williamson Pit trial evaporation ponds and is conducting limited duration, field scale trials to demonstrate the feasibility of commercial scale potash production at Lake Way.

Based on these studies, SO4 is progressing with approvals and construction of a demonstration project, which includes brine production bores, a brine transfer network, evaporation ponds and demonstration plant.

# Healthy Pizza Scrolls

## Ingredients

- \* 2 cups of self-raising flour
- \* 1 cup wholemeal self-raising flour
- \* 3 tbs margarine
- \* 1 cup of low-fat milk
- \* 1 cup of low-fat cheese, grated
- \* 3 tbs no-added-salt tomato paste
- \* 2 cups pizza toppings (see suggestions below), finely chopped
- \*



## Method

1. Preheat oven to 180°C and line a large tray with baking paper
2. Add the flours to a large bowl. Use your fingers to rub the margarine into the flour until the mixture looks like fine breadcrumbs.
3. Add the milk and mix together to make a soft dough.
4. Sprinkle the bench-top with a little flour. Use a rolling pin to roll the dough out into a rectangle shape about 40 x 30cm.
5. Spread the tomato paste over the dough and sprinkle the cheese and other toppings evenly over the dough.
6. Tightly roll up the dough (from the long side) into a log shape
7. Cut the log into 12 slices and lay the slices flat on the tray
8. Bake for 20–30 minutes until lightly golden

## Variation:

Vegie pizza: mushrooms, onion, capsicum, olives, Italian mixed herbs

Mexican pizza: salsa (instead of tomato paste), corn, capsicum, red onion, kidney beans

Tropical Pizza: pineapple, shredded cooked chicken, onion, zucchini

This snack can be individually wrapped in cling wrap and can be frozen for up to 3 months and placed in lunch boxes still frozen. They will be defrosted by recess time.

## Ingredients

- \* 2 wholemeal or wholegrain wraps
- \* 2 tbs passata (tomato puree)
- \* 1/4 red onion, thinly sliced
- \* 180 g cooked chicken, shredded
- \* 1/2 capsicum, Thinly sliced
- \* 5 cherry tomatoes, halved
- \* 1 tsp dried mixed herbs
- \* 1/2 cup reduced-fat mozzarella cheese
- \* 1 cup baby spinach leaves
- \* 1 carrot, thinly sliced
- \* 1/2 cucumber, chopped
- \* Other toppings include, mushrooms, pineapple, olives and kidney beans.



## Method

1. Preheat oven to 220°C (200°C fan forced)
2. Spread tomato paste evenly over pizza base. Top with sliced onion, chicken, capsicum strips and tomato. Sprinkle with mixed herbs and cheese and place on a baking tray, pizza stone or wire rack.
3. Bake for 5 minutes until cheese is melted then cover with foil to prevent burning. Bake for a further 5 minutes until base is crisp.
4. Serve with a simple salad of baby spinach, carrot and cucumber.

**Variation:** Make mini pizzas on English muffin halves. Perfect for lunchboxes.
