Acting CEO's Report

Unfortunately the party is over – at least for a while.

Like many in the community, I have enjoyed a lot of the community activities that we have shared together over the past couple of years or so – the regular bingo nights, karaoke parties, not to mention the bigger (if less regular) events like the community Christmas party, Australia Day, ANZAC day etc.

I especially enjoyed the events held last September with Mary G, Gina Williams and Guy Ghouse, and the Ray Ryder Band (not to mention the fireworks!).

So I have been particularly looking forward to the Harmony Event that was planned for later this month, and the visit by Mary G.

BUT

- We are now in the grip of a global pandemic of a new and previously unknown virus (COVID-19).
- Because the virus is so new, our species has not yet developed any natural resistance to it.
- There is not yet any vaccine available to fight the virus.
- The rate of spread of the infection is accelerating exponentially on a daily basis.
- The only tools that we currently have to try to slow the progress of the virus are good hygiene and the tried and true methods that have been applied since the great plague that swept through London (and other parts of Europe) in the mid-17th century. We are now calling these methods “social distancing”.

This requires urgent changes in all of our lives - in what we do, and how we do it.

Events that bring people physically close together are being cancelled across Australia and the world.

The Prime Minister has announced that there will be no local ANZAC Day events this year to mark what is one of the most important national days in both Australia and New Zealand. Instead, we will stay at home and watch the televised ANZAC Day ceremonies.

Companies across Australia are cancelling their Board meetings and using our 21st century technologies to hold telephone conferences and video conferences instead.

Some retailers are closing their doors and are now only selling online.

Many organisations (including local governments) have already introduced “working from home” to protect their staff and their communities.

The Shire of Wiluna is also doing its part, and effective immediately has introduced the following measures:

- **All events planned in the immediate future have been cancelled. That is, the Harmony Day Picnic has been cancelled, bingo is cancelled, karaoke is cancelled, the ANZAC Day dawn parade is cancelled. We will reschedule and/or resume these activities when the pandemic has subsided.**
- **Effective immediately, the Wiluna Swimming Pool is closed for this season.**
- **All future bookings of Shire facilities have been cancelled.**
- **The after-school program has been cancelled.**
- **The Shire Office is closed to the public. At this stage there are still staff in the office (ie. we haven't yet moved to a "working from home" regime) and we are still providing a full range of "non-contact" services. But to access those services you will need to telephone or email the Shire.**
- **The Canning-Gunbarrel Discovery Centre is closed to the public.**
- **The Tjukurba Art Gallery is closed. Our artists are being supplied with materials and are "working from home", and we will still be pursuing online art sales to try to maintain our artists incomes.**
- **The Tjukurba Art Gallery's participation in Revealed 2020 and other art exhibitions has been cancelled. In reality, those exhibitions have already been cancelled or are about to be cancelled.**
- **Unnecessary travel by Shire staff has been prohibited.**

The Shire will still be providing essential services, such as refuse collection and road maintenance. The kerbside collection on 31 March and 1st April will still take place.

This is not a time for panic. To put things into perspective, there are less people who have so far died from COVID-19 than from the flu in a bad flu season. But the flu has been around a long time so we have a certain amount of immunity (which can be boosted by having annual flu vaccinations), and our health system can generally cope with the flu.

Most people who become infected with COVID-19 will probably survive it okay – those most at risk are the elderly and those with other health problems.

But that is not really the point at the moment – we need to slow down the spread of the disease so that those requiring treatment are kept to manageable numbers that our health system can cope with, and to give the medical scientists around the world time to produce a vaccine that will hopefully stop the pandemic in its tracks.

Everybody needs to help:

- **Wash your hands (frequently, not just after going to the toilet).**
- **Don't finger your eyes, nose or mouth.**
- **Stop shaking hands.**
- **Keep 1½ or 2 metres away from other people.**
- **So far as possible, conduct your business electronically.**

Our mines have Fly-In-Fly-Out workforces which are a potential source of infection. One of the local mines already has a worker in isolation, and the mines are stopping their people from coming to town to help keep us safe. Please help by not visiting the mines unless you have real business going there.

This pandemic will eventually pass (as all pandemics do) and we will then be able to resume all our social activities.

Take care and keep healthy

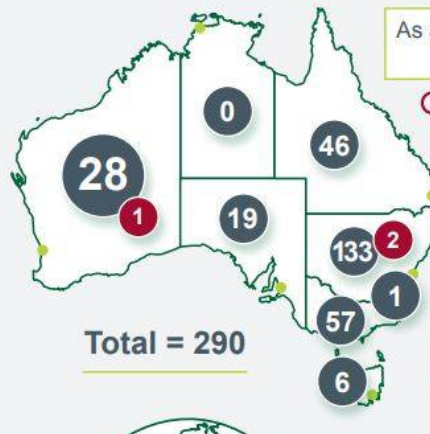

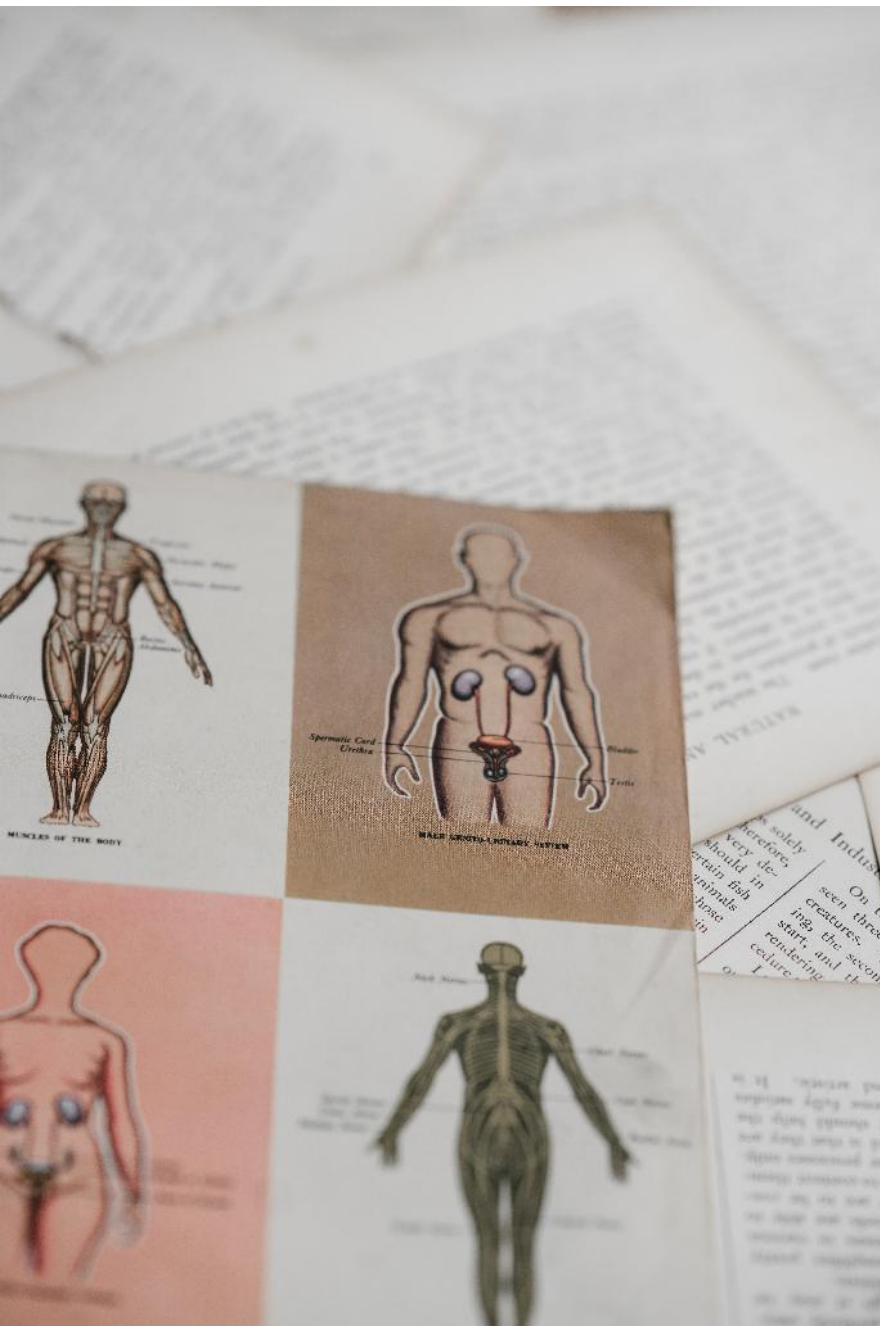

REPORT FROM THE RECREATION AND LEISURE COORDINATOR

Summertime in Wiluna

Finally, the cold wind, rain and water have gone to be replaced with the hot sun, hot wind, hot nights, blow flies and mozzies taking their best shot at anybody brave enough to walk around town. I see that we have improved our skills at the one-hand-wave, the flutter in front of your face or the crazy arms to keep the flying stinging beasts at bay. I have noticed that the smart fellas are using tree twigs with a few leaves on them to swipe the pests down as the gravitate to your most sensitive parts like the ears, nose, lips or in your mouth.

The pool has been the go-to place for the Wiluna children and families during the month of February. Hayley and Tevita have been assisting Ken, the pool manager, with the afternoon and school swimming program. We are pleased to say that we have built a great working relationship with Ken. This has allowed us to make slight changes to our and the pool program to facilitate community activities without clashing or competing for the same time to hold programs. The flow on is for us all - we have co-hosted three community barbeques/discos at the pool, while Ken has been keen to help host three Blue Boys Discos at the center.

Personal Responsibility

Late last year some of our young people decided to smash the security lights and cameras at the pavilion. All the children involved in this incident were spoken to. Some of the young people were given behavior-based contracts, which held the children accountable for their behavior. I am pleased to say that the family took control of the situation by signing up for the program, which uses a graduate process for the boys to start accessing the community pool again and ultimately, using this community resource on their own.

As part of the program, the boys' parents needed to attend the pool with the boys for a set period of time. The family also understood that if the boys broke the contract, they would have been banned from the pool for the rest of the swimming season.

Ken's feedback to me centered around how much fun the family had during the transition time with their sons. He also stated that his relationship with the family developed because of the common goal; spending time together and simply getting to know each other. The boys modified their behavior and showed they can make positive choices if held accountable for their actions. Having adults, families and service providers working together works if the goal is a common goal - and worth working towards.

The cost to replace the security lights and cameras were just under \$5,000. Tevita, Hayley and I could buy a lot of resources and run many programs with this money. If you see the children damaging lights, buildings and property, please say something, do something! By looking for positive resolutions, we may end up with positive outcomes, like the one above.



Recidivist offending is a habit and habits are formed over time. That means every time we intervene, we put a roadblock in the way for that young person. This gives the offender time to listen and to think and gives us time to yarn to and work with.

If we walk past an incident, ignore it or simply watch but do not act, that child involved in petty crime today may be the teenager that steals your car or breaks into your home tomorrow.

National Aboriginal Second Chance Academy

Amy and her crew spent the third week of Term 1 in town. They ran a two-day basketball clinic and spent two days on the oval, playing footy. Once again, the children showed us how keen they all are to learn new skills and interact with new people in town. Amy and the team ended their four-day sports program with a footy match and barbeque on the oval. It was pleasing to see service providers from all organizations in town coming together to support the children, having a yarn and a bite to eat.

Bingo and Karaoke

Unfortunately, the last scheduled Bingo did not take place this as we did not get enough participants due to sorry business in town.

The next Bingo night will be held on Wednesday, 1st of April. Doors will be open at 6.00 pm and the first game starts at 6.30 pm. Save up your pennies, come and join us and try your luck come on down to try your luck. Remember: Bingo is an adult and BYO event, which means no children are allowed to attend. Feel free to bring some beers and nibbles.

We will be holding our next Karaoke event on Saturday, 21st of March from 5.00 pm until 10.30 pm. This, is an adult only and BYO event.

Wiluna Family Harmony Fun Days

The Wiluna Family Harmony Fun Days will be held over two days at the end of the month. Mary G, Queen of the North, will be here to share her music and humor with us. Mary will be holding a small community concert, as well as her National radio show from good old Wiluna on Wednesday, 25 of March. 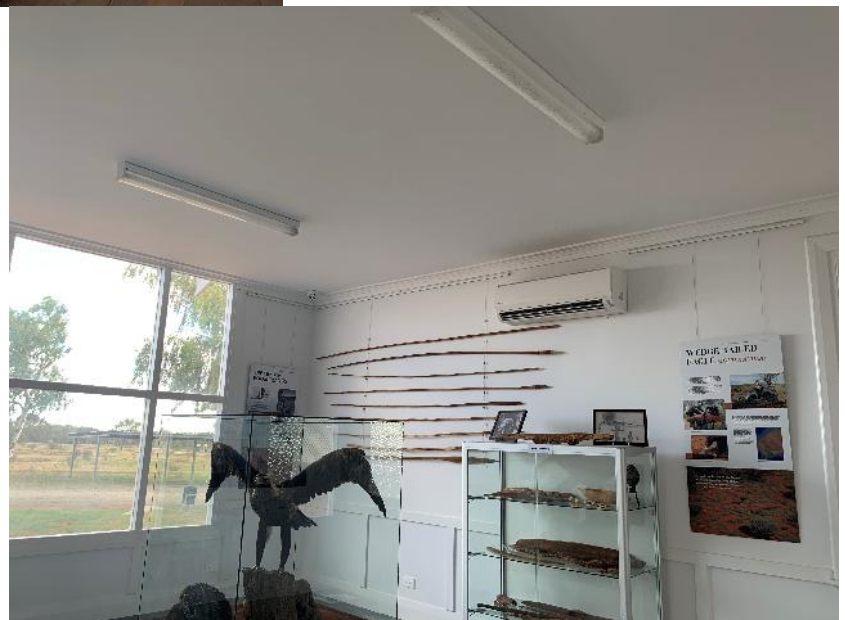

To our customers and residents of Wiluna we wish to inform everyone the issue with trading at the shop and Post Office in the coming 6- months as the world comes to grips with this one in one 100 year crisis.

We want to tell you not to panic **no one will go hungry** everyone will be served but things are going to be a little different and we need to do this to keep everyone safe.

Nearly all the food you eat and sold at Wiluna Traders is grown or produced in Australia.

Australia will not run out of food and neither will the shop

Yes we may have shortages due to supply issues but we will be better placed than Perth I can assure you because our population is small its more manageable to supply.

There is no need to stock up too much our shop is only a small shop and we do not have secure places to store food offsite because off risk of spoilage, temperature control and break ins etc

Don't worry the trucks will keep coming the fresh food will keep coming the dry-goods will keep coming each week.

Please do not come to the shop if you have any symptoms such as a cold a runny nose or aches or fever keep our community safe. We think its best children do not enter the shop for the time being as children will struggle to keep to the rules of hygiene expected from all of us.

Please we ask you to **stop using cash and coin** as much as possible use your key-cards its safer and more hygienic. Soon new rules may be introduced on how to conduct shopping safely.

These rules are for your safety and protection please comply our staff are doing everything they can too support you please be patient.

Our Leaders have asked us not to panic not to be greedy and obey the rules of social distancing.

So remember follow the rules move away from using cash, **ask kids to stay away from shop or as much as possible.**

SO4 is developing its first operation at Lake Way where potassium rich brine will be abstracted and used to produce a high quality, premium grade sulphate of potash fertiliser.

Project Progress

SO4 is progressing well with approvals and construction of its Lake Way potash project.

We recently completed Stage 2 construction and commenced early-works for the off-lake village and demonstration plant to prepare for the construction to commence in April 2020.

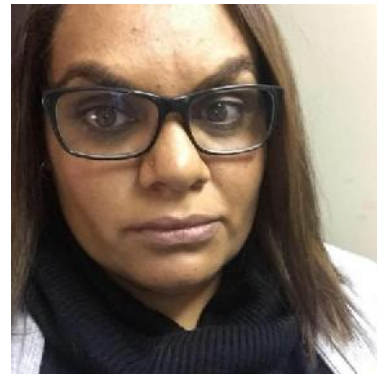
SO4 has moved our community, heritage and SOP programs into our new SO4 community offices, centrally located on Wiluna's Wotton street.

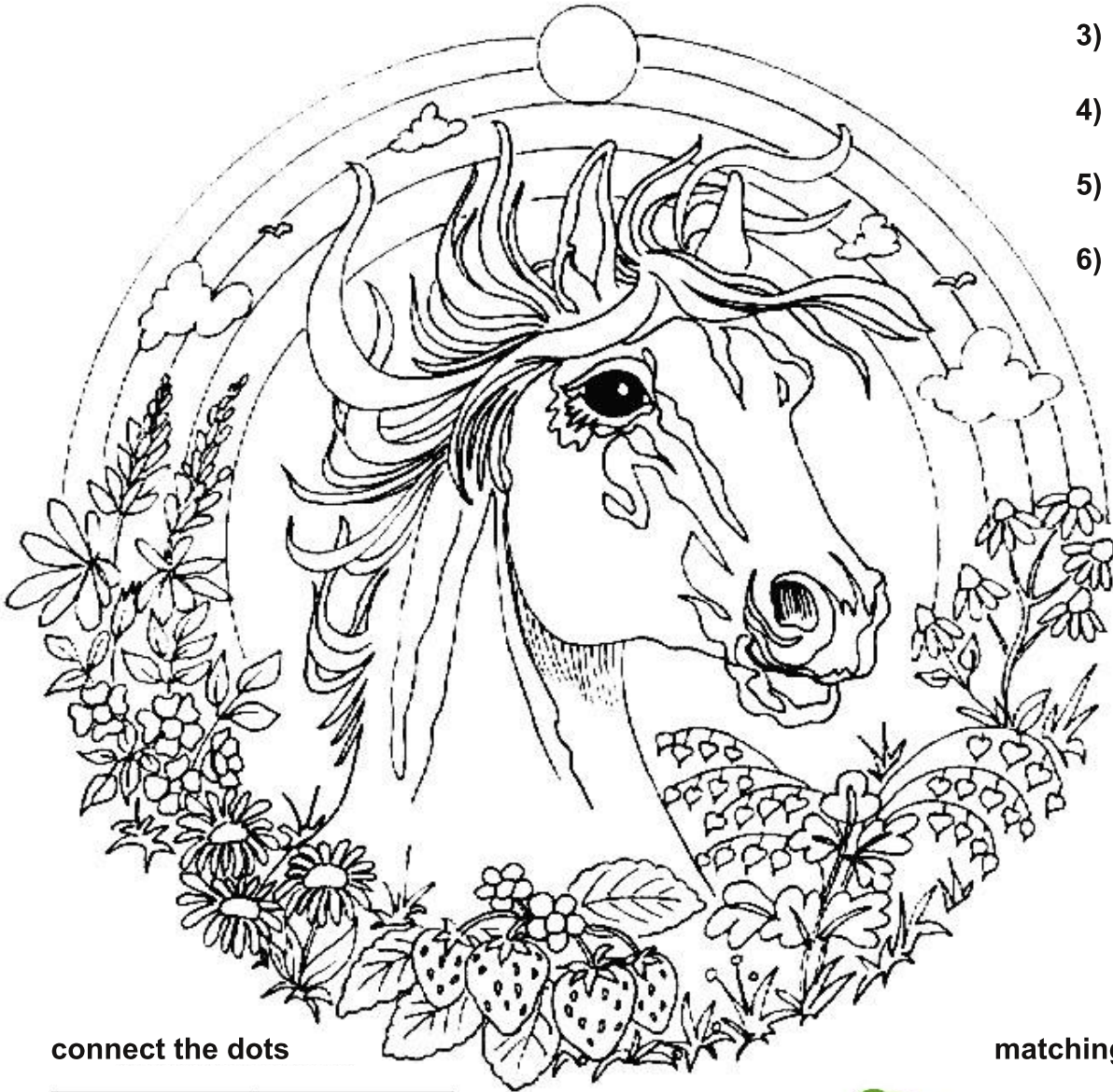
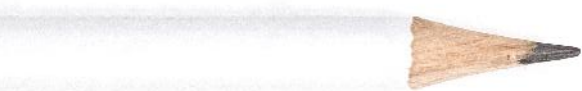

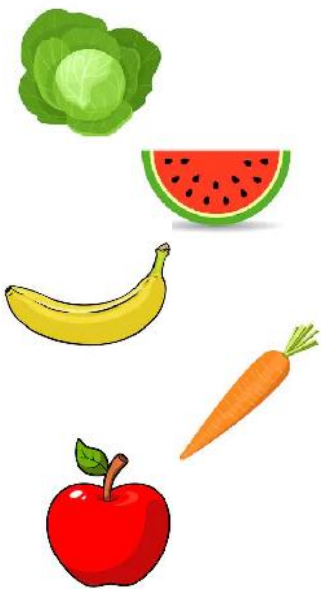
